- Incorporated in 1854, Androscoggin is a county in southern Maine that hosts two of Maine's largest cities, Lewiston and Auburn, also known as the "Twin Cities". The county is centrally located and is approximately one-half hour from both Portland, Maine's largest city, and Augusta, Maine's capital.
- > In 2007, Androscoggin County's population was estimated at 106,837.
- > 8% of Maine's total population resides in Androscoggin County.
- \triangleright In 2007, the juvenile population was estimated at 24,371.

- > Population growth in Androscoggin County (3.0% increase from 2000 to 2008) has been close to the statewide growth rate of 3.3%.
- > The population is younger than the statewide average.
 - Persons under 18 account for 22.8% of Androscoggin County's population compared with the statewide average of 21.2%.
- **Educational attainment is lower than the statewide average.**
 - 79.8% of those ages 25+ in Androscoggin County have graduated from high school compared with the statewide average of 85.4%.
 - 14.4% of those ages 25+ in Androscoggin County have obtained a bachelor's degree or higher compared with the statewide average of 22.9%.
- Most income measures are lower and poverty is higher than statewide averages.
 - The median household income in Androscoggin County is \$45,254 compared with a statewide average of \$45,832.
 - 14.1% of Androscoggin County residents live below the poverty line compared with a statewide average of 12.2%.
- Population density: 227 people per square mile (Statewide: 41.3 people per square mile)
- > Largest cities (population): Lewiston (35,234), Auburn (23,203), Lisbon (9,328)

Lewiston-Auburn Justice System Information

- > As of printing, the Lewiston Police Department is the only police force in Maine certified by the National Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies.⁴
- > Lewiston-Auburn's crime rate is lower than the other major metropolitan areas in Maine, including Bangor, Augusta, and Portland.⁵
- > Lewiston-Auburn was rated as the 60th safest metropolitan area in the country according to CQ Press.⁶

Adult Criminal Justice Highlights:


ARRESTS HAVE INCREASED AMONG ADULTS, BUT INDEX CRIMES, THE EIGHT CRIMES (HOMICIDE, ROBBERY, FORCIBLE RAPE, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, BURGLARY, LARCENY/THEFT, MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT, AND ARSON) THE FBI COMBINES TO PRODUCE ITS ANNUAL CRIME INDEX, HAVE DECREASED OVER THE LAST 10 YEARS.


- > Adult arrests increased by 15.2% over the last 5 years and increased 13.7% over the last 10 years.
- ➤ Index crimes decreased by 10.1% over the last 5 years and decreased 32.4% over the last 10 years. Nonetheless, violent crime increased 25% over the past 5 years, returning to their 1998 levels. However, property crimes, which make up the large percentage of index crimes, decreased by 11.2% over the last 5 years and 33.6% over the last 10 years.
- > In 2007, there were 26.1 index crimes per 1,000 residents, comparable to the statewide rate of 25.7 index crimes per 1,000 residents.




JUVENILE ARRESTS HAVE DECLINED OVER THE PAST 10 YEARS, BUT RECIDIVISM RATES REMAIN HIGH.


- > Juvenile arrests have decreased 28.6% over the past 5 years and decreased 56.3% over the past 10 years.
- > The juvenile recidivism rate for the 2005 cohort was 35%. This was the second highest rate in 2005 in Maine (after Somerset County).
- > Androscoggin County had the second hightest rate (after Sagadahoc County) of juveniles adjudicated for the first time in 2005 at 13.5 per 1,000 population.



 - o Persons under 18 account for 19.8% of Aroostook County's population compared with the statewide average of 21.2%.
- **Educational attainment is lower than the statewide average.**
 - o 76.9% of those ages 25+ in Aroostook County have graduated from high school compared with the statewide average of 85.4%.
 - o 14.6% of those ages 25+ in Aroostook County have obtained a bachelor's degree or higher compared with the statewide average of 22.9%.
- > Most income measures are lower and poverty is higher than statewide averages.
 - o The median household income in Aroostook County is \$35,438 compared with a statewide average of \$45,832.
 - o 17.4% of Aroostook County residents live below the poverty line compared with a statewide average of 12.2%.


AROOSTOOK COUNTY HAS THE SECOND LOWEST RATE OF INDEX CRIMES IN THE STATE. HOWEVER, THE VIOLENT CRIME RATE HAS INCREASED 35.9% OVER THE LAST 5 YEARS; THE PROPERTY CRIME RATE HAS DECREASED BY 14.3% OVER THE SAME PERIOD.


- > The adult arrest rate has remained relatively constant, increasing by 9.4% over the last 5 years, but registering an overall decline of 3% over the last 10 years.
- > In 2007, Aroostook County had the second lowest rate of index crimes- 17.1 per 1,000 residents. The state average is 25.7 per 1,000 residents.
- > Index crimes decreased by 12.7% over the last 5 years and decreased 10.9% over the last 10 years. Nonetheless, violent crime showed a 35.9% increase over the past 5 years. However, property crimes, which make up the large percentage of index crimes, decreased by 14.3% over the last 5 years and 12% over the last 10 years.




JUVENILE ARRESTS HAVE SHOWN A STEEP DECLINE OVER THE PAST 10 YEARS. THE JUVENILE RECIDIVISM RATE ALSO REMAINS LOW COMPARED WITH THE STATE AVERAGE.


- > The juvenile arrest rate has declined by 27.9% over the last 5 years; over 10 years, the decline in juvenile arrests is even more pronounced, registering a 52.7% decrease.
- > In 2005, the rate of juveniles adjudicated for the first time in 2005 was 6.2 per 1,000 residents. This was a 54% decline from the previous year.
- > In 2005, the juvenile recidivism rate was 23%. This was below the statewide average of 27% in 2005.



- > The population is the same average age as the state average.
 - Persons under 18 account for 21.8% of Cumberland County's population compared with the statewide average of 21.8%.
- Educational attainment is significantly higher than the statewide average.
 - 90.1% of those ages 25+ in Cumberland County have graduated from high school compared with the statewide average of 85.4%.
 - 34.2% of those ages 25+ in Cumberland County have obtained a bachelor's degree or higher compared with the statewide average of 22.9%.
- Most income measures are higher than average and poverty is lower.
 - The median household income in Cumberland County is \$54,992 compared with a statewide average of \$45,832.
 - o 9.7% of Cumberland County residents live below the poverty line compared with a statewide average of 12.2%.


Arrests have increased among adults, but index crimes, the eight crimes (homicide, robbery, forcible rape, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny/theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson) the FBI combines to produce its annual crime index, have decreased in the past 10 years.


- > The adult arrest rate has increased 16.8% over the last 5 years and increased 19.1% over the last 10 years. The female adult arrest rate has increased more rapidly than the male arrest rate, registering a 65.4% increase over the past 10 years, compared with a 9.1% increase for men.
- ➤ In 2007, Cumberland County had the third highest rate of index crimes- 29.0 per 1,000 residents. The statewide average is 25.7 per 1,000 residents.
- > Index crimes have declined by 25.4% over the last 10 years. Similarly, the violent crime rate has decreased 15.8% and the property crime rate has decreased 26.2% over the same time period.






- > The juvenile arrest rate has declined by 12.6% over the last 5 years; over 10 years, the percentage decrease doubles to 25.4%.
- > In 2005, the rate of juveniles adjudicated for the first time was 6.6 per 1,000 residents. This was below the statewide average of 8.4 in 2005.
- > In 2005, the juvenile recidivism rate was 30%. This was above the statewide average of 27% in 2005.






- > The adult arrest rate has barely changed over the last 5 years, but has increased 37.2% over the last 10 years.


The adult arrest rate and index crime rate have remained relatively steady in Penobscot County over the past 10 years. Nonetheless, the county has the highest index crime rate in the state.


- > The adult arrest rate has remained steady, increasing only 2.5% over the last 5 years and increasing 4.6% over the last 10 years. However, the female adult arrest rate has grown rapidly compared to the male arrest rate, increasing 34.8% over 5 years and increasing 16.2% over 10 years. Conversely, the male arrest rate registered slight overall declines over those same time periods.
- ➤ In 2007, Penobscot County had the highest index crime rate in the state at 33.6 per 1,000 residents. The statewide average is 25.7 per 1,000 residents.
- > The index crime rate has remained relatively steady over the past few years, increasing 8.3% over the last 5 years and only increasing 2.1% over the last 10 years. The violent crime rate showed a fairly pronounced decline, decreasing 18.2% over the last 5 years and decreasing by 40% over the last 10 years.



- > Population growth in York County (8.0% increase from 2000 to 2008) has been faster than the statewide average (3.3% increase from 2000 to 2008).
- > The population is younger than the statewide average.
 - o Persons under 18 account for 22.0% of York County's population compared with the statewide average of 21.2%.
- **Educational attainment is similar to the statewide average.**
 - o 86.5% of those ages 25+ in York County have graduated from high school compared with the statewide average of 85.4%.




- > The adult arrest rate has remained relatively steady, increasing by 6.1% over the last 5 years and increasing by 5.8% over the last 10 years.
- > In 2007, York County had an index crime rate of 23.9 per 1,000 residents. The statewide average is 25.7 per 1,000 residents.
- Index crimes increased by 9.3% over the last 5 years, but registered a net decline of 23.2% over a 10 year period.






- > The juvenile arrest rate has declined by 22.9% over the last 5 years and decreased by 26.7% over the last 10 years.
- > In 2005, the rate of juveniles adjudicated for the first time was 7.6 per 1,000 residents. This was comparable to the statewide average of 8.4 per 1,000 residents in 2005.
- > In 2005, the juvenile recidivism rate was 26%. This was comparable to the statewide average of 27% in 2005.


