"Eugene, Willie Mailhot"

E.W. Mailhot was ~~one of the~~ ^{the} first sausage manufacturers in the twin cities, opening a business in the new Auburn area in 1910

He was the son of Delphis and Leona Verville, Mailhot, a Franco American family who settled in Lewiston in the 1800's ^{1st child} (1881) and Mr. E.W. Mailhot was born in 1881

was married to the former Odile ~~Rochester~~ ^{Merin}

He was a self-made man and his high ideals and honest character gained for him the trust and friendship of all his fellowmen.

He was a church going man, and among his many accomplishments, was chosen to serve as ^{early} President of "Saint Vincent de Paul Society" of St. Peter and St. Paul parish; a post he held for many years until his death in 1941 - His son ^{Delphis} ^{of St. Paul} - also son of Robert ^{Roger}

Mr. Mailhot was the father of a large family, eight of them still living in the Lewiston, Auburn area.

After the great Auburn fire of 1933,
with ^{Alcide} ^{Mrs. Mailhot} relocated his operation to Lewiston,
at 159 Bates street, where he resided at the time
When he passed away in 1941, his oldest
son Robert, managed the business with his
brother Lionel at same location.

Today Robert and his sons, who are a
third generation descendents of the Mailhot family
are now successfully operating the sausage
business in a new modern plant, built
in 1960 at 258-260 Bartlett street in
Lewiston, Maine under the name of
"E.W. Mailhot Sausage Co."
