Dear Mrs. Kauffman,

Due to a severe attack of the Grippe Miss Charlotte Michaud has not been able to answer your letter of March 5, and she asked me if I could do so for her.

I am enclosing two clippings from our local newspaper. I hardly think it advisable to publish any more names of patrons and patronesses of the Monte Carlo Ballet Russe performance at Portland, March 26, as so many persons have obtained their tickets directly from the Portland office that the list available would probably be very incomplete.
