
Turnpike Exit 15 from Portland: take Winthrop Ramp to turnpike mall

She refused & was then fired for being "temporarily unsuitable".

Between Friends by Gillian E. Hanscombe (Alyson, \$5.95)

is a wonderful novel which explores many of the most passionately felt issues in the lesbian feminist community - monogamy, communal living, lesbian-straight relations, lesbian motherhood, male children in the lesbian community, the place of love in a political movement, support for each other, etc. Written in the form of letters between Meg, a lesbian living in London with her young son and her longtime lover; Meg's homophobic college friend, Frances, who lives with her turkey of a husband in Canada; Argy, who with her lover Tim is working hard to create a non-sexist heterosexual relationship; and Jane, a separatist who believes women should give up their male children. It is surprising how dramatic these letters become as the four friends challenge each other to take risks and to re-think their very different lives. A novel of intrigue, betrayal, and courage which is both contemplative and full of suspense. Once you pick it up, you won't be able to put it down!

Gillian Hanscombe also has written with Jackie Forster a book on Lesbian mothers, **Rocking the Cradle**, (Alyson, \$5.95). It is based on interviews with a wide variety of lesbians and their children in England and Wales. They cover many topics including custody and artificial insemination and there is a wonderful chapter of kids talking about their experiences as children of lesbians.
