

THE UNITED HEALTH CARE PROJECT: QUALITY HEALTH CARE FOR LESBIANS AND GAYS by Anne Berner and Shelley Cohen

The United, an organization of lesbians, gay men and their supporters in Madison, Wisconsin is implementing a health care project to assiss the health care needs and to change practives, policies and procedures that inhibit the delivery of quality health care to our community. The proj received funding from the City of Madison Human Services Department and will continue through December, 1980 (? ed.) At that point the future of the project will depend on the availablility of funds. To the best of

our knowledge this is the first project of its kind in the countyr.
he project is comprised of four parts: health care needs assessment of the lesbian and gay community, policy review and revision, eduction and advocacy. In the initial stages of the project a needs assessment questionnaire was widely distributed throughout Madison's license lesbian and gay community in an ifffort to locate and identify the heal care needs of our community as well as identify the potentially discriminating aspects of the "traditional" health care system. The results o the questionnareillustrated cases of both overt and covert discriminatine most pointed example of overt discrimination resulted in denial of treatment. Covert discrimination, although more difficult to pinppint, also reported primarily with respect to the heterosexist assumptions inherent in the delivery of patient care. The fact that women are routinely asked prior to receiving treatment whether or not thaey are on birth control clearly illustrates this bias.

The policy component of the project focuses on hospital policies that assume a conventional definition of the family. This poses a particular problem with intensive care unit policies which restrict vistion in most cases to family members. As a result, the rights of lesbis and gay patients and their significant others may be denied. The units Health Care Project has been requesting area hospitals to adopt the phr "significant other(s)" to their intensive care unit visitation policies

to address this issue. In addition, the inclusion of "sexual orientati in the Patients Bill of Fights has also been requested.

The information gathered from the needs assessment high lkghted a lack of appropriate education among health care workers regarding homosexuality, thus perpetuating the existence of homophobic attitudes.and In response to this problem inservice workshops have been practices. designed and presented to area hospitals and clincis. +he workshops em size demytholigizing the gay/lesbian patient, sensitizing practitioners to key issues and encouraging them to explore their own attutudes concerning sexuality.

Because of the oftentimes intimidating atmosphere of the taraditic health care delivery system an advocacy program has been designed. This service will be provided by and for gay men and lesbians at their requestionable will be trained to assist the health care consumer in several ways. Developing strategies, formulating queations, providing financial information and accompanying the consumer to the visit are among the sevices advocates can provide. Self-advocacy is the ultimate goal of this

type of service.

Educating our community has also been a project focus. In Septem we will be do-sponsoring a forum on preventitive health care for gay me and lesbians in conjunction with local community health center. The for will concentrate on issues specific to our community and will include a sidcussion on how to deal with the heterosexist sttitudes and practice prevalent throughout the traditional health care sustem. We will apsoed cate the participants about their rights as patients and thus, encourage them to act as their own advocate.

A Lesbian and Gay Health , Care Workers Alliance has also been org ized to offer support for those working in the oftentimes alienating h ital environment. he organization functions as a support group at pre and hopes to expand its goals in the future. We see the support group profiding advocacy from within the system, thus helping to sinsure the needs of the lesbian/gay patient are met.
