ORAL REPORT FROM PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE

Bill Banger, Chairman of the Publications Committee, reported to the Board on the progress being made on publications guidelines but stated as yet the Committee has not completed a final written report to the Board of Trustees. Mr. Voorhees suggested that the Committee complete its report and present it to the Board at a later meeting.

STEVENS CONSTRUCTION COMPANY REMODELING CONTRACT

Action was deferred upon the final approval and acceptance of building alterations and remodeling work performed by Stevens Construction Company at a total contract cost of \$70,343.

STUDENT UNION BUILDING CONTRACT AWARDS

Construction contracts in the amount of \$1,870,679 for the new Student Union Building, contingent upon the sale of the bonds, were presented to the Board for approval.

Mr. Erickson moved that the Board approve awarding of construction contracts to the contractors as recommended below. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Wilson and was passed.

General construction contract awarded to Hoffman Contractors of Spokane, on a low basic bid of \$1,227,000.

Mechanical construction contract awarded to Standard Plumbing and Heating of Spokane, on a low basic bid of \$490,679.

Electrical construction contract awarded to Electric Smith Company of Spokane, on a low basic bid of \$153,000.

In addition to the above recommendations, Mr. Erickson moved that the Board authorize the election of add alternates G-1, G-2, M-1, and E-1 by change order if sufficient funds should become available at a later date. Mrs. Wilson seconded this motion and the motion was passed.

CONTRACT AWARD FOR DESIGN OF BUILDING ALTERATIONS AND REMODELING

An architectural contract award to the firm of Boyington and Read, Architects, for the design of building alterations and remodeling work during the 1969-71 biennium at a maximum allowable construction cost of \$220,000 was approved in a motion by Mr. Erickson and seconded by Mrs. Wilson and passed. Both Mr. Boyington and Mr. Read were introduced to the Board members.

JACK REEVES RETAINED AS UTILITY CONSULTANT FOR COLLEGE

A recommendation to retain Jack Reeves as a utility services consultant for the College was presented to the Board. It was moved by Mr. Erickson, seconded by Mrs. Wilson and passed that Mr. Reeves' future employment on a retainer basis be approved.

SALE OF STUDENT ACTIVITY FACILITIES FEE REVENUE BONDS, SERIES A, 1969

Mrs. Wilson moved that the Board approve adoption of a resolution of the Board of Trustees of Eastern Washington State College authorizing issuance and sale of Student Activity Facilities Fee Revenue Bonds, Series A and B, 1969, in the amount of \$2,300,000 and that the Secretary be authorized and directed to advertise for bids by short and long form notice of sale. This resolution replaces the resolution adopted May 17, 1968. The motion was seconded by Mr. Erickson and passed. (See attached copy of proceedings.)

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO LOAN AGREEMENT

Adoption of Amendment No. 1 to the Loan Agreement of May 1, 1968, between the College and the Department of Housing and Urban Development was approved in a motion by Mr. Erickson, seconded by Mrs. Wilson and passed. This loan agreement covers the \$500,000 of Series B Bonds to be purchased by the Government.

REVISED JUDICIAL CODE

Mr. Gary Rental, Executive Vice President of the Associated Student Body, presented the revised Judicial Code to the Board for their approval. This code was formally passed by the Associated Student Council at their meeting held on January 23. Mrs. Wilson moved that this revised Judicial Code be approved by the Board. The motion was seconded by Mr. Erickson and passed.
