He received his education at Oxford University, (B.A., 1st class, Classics and Theology, 1948; M.A. and D.Phil., 1954). Ordained in 1952, he served as assistant minister at St. John's Church of England, Harborne, Birmingham until 1954. From 1955 to 1961 he was Senior Tutor at Tyndale Hall, an Anglican seminary in Bristol. He is now Warden of Latimer House, Oxford, an Anglican evangelical study center.

His published works include Fundamentalism and the Word of God, 1958; Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God, 1961; and God Has Spoken, 1965. With O. R. Johnston he translated and edited Luther's Bondage of the Will, 1958. He edited The Church of England and the Methodist Church, 1963; and All in Each Place, 1965; and was consulting editor of The New Bible Dictionary, 1962.

Dr. Packer has preached and lectured widely in Great Britain, and is a frequent contributor to theological journals and periodicals.



Fuller Theological Seminary instituted the Payton Lectures in 1948, providing for a series of divinity lectures annually by a competent scholar outside the regular faculty, in one of the following areas: the uniqueness or confirmation of the historic Christian faith, the confutation of non-Christian or sub-Christian views, or the formulation of Biblical doctrines.

The Lectures are named for Dr. and Mrs. John E. Payton, the parents of Mrs. Charles E. Fuller, wife of the founder of the Seminary.
