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



Action Brought In Behalf of Child.

CONTINUE DEFENSE TODAY

Averring that he was scratched by a performing monkey while attending a performance at a local theater on May 7, 1920. Vincent J. O'Neill, four years old, No. 1946 Seneca street, commenced suit yesterday by guardian in supreme court before Justice Charles B. Wheeler. Five thousand dollars is asked. The defense will continue its case this

ler. Five thousand dollars is asked. The defense will continue its case this morning.

It is the allegation in the suit that the O'Neill child was seated in the front row of the theater with an aunt, Mrs. William J. Lenahan; a grandmother, Mrs. Matthew Dwyer, and Mrs. Joseph Walsh. During an animal act a monkey who played no regular part in the show imped from the stage to the brass rail behind the orchestra and from there onto the child whom, it is contended, the creature scratched on the face.

Mrs. Lenahan, the first witness yesterday, testified that she had the child seated on her lap during the performance. When the animal act was offered the monkey left the stage, she said, kissed the youngster and then hopped back onto the stage. Shortly after, she said, the creature leaped onto the rail and from there onto the child, scratching his face.

Mrs. Catherine O'Neill, mother of the youngster, testified that as a result of the accident her son had been made nervous. She also said that his appetite was not what it should be. In addition, she declared, the baby had grown afraid of any kind of animal. Dr. E. A. Sharp. No. 481 Franklin street, said that when he attended the baby it had a sort of nervousness similar to a mild form of St. Vitus dance.

Mrs. Dwyer and Mrs. Walsh corroborated Mrs. Lenahan's testimony.

The first witness for the defense was Henry J. Carr, manager of the theater. He said that the act opened May 1 and played twice each day during the week.

"The monkey came down into the orchestra pit," said Mr. Carr. "It was what is called a 'clown monk.' It had no regular part in the show except to amuse."

"Did it attack anyone else?" Mr. Powell asked.

Mr. Carr said it did not.

Upon being cross-examined by Mr. Spring, Mr. Carr said that there were four or five monkeys in the act, which was called "Padrini's Animals." He said he had seen the monkey come down onto the rall earlier in the week, but he had not observed it going among the audience.

"Do you remember Herman Schultz, the orchestra director, complaining about the monkey?" asked Mr. Spring.

"I don't remember anyone complaining," Mr. Carr said.

Mr. Schultz said he did not see the accident, and added he did not recall complaints about it, although he said the animal had climbed on his shoulders. Mr. Schultz denied the monkey had stood on his head.

O'Neill, three years old, of No. 1946 Seneca street, against the Shea Amusement company. The plaintiff alleges that the child was scratched by a small monkey while attending a performance at Shea's vaudeville theater on May 7, 1920

ance at Shea's vaudeville theater on May 7, 1920.

Mrs. William J. Lenehan, an aunt, testified that she was holding the child when the monkey leaped from the stage onto the brass rail, surrounding the musicians' pit, and then onto the child. They were seated in the first row at the afternoon performance. Dr. E. A. Sharp testified to having treated the child for nervousness and the mother said that the child's health was impaired as a result of the experience and that he now shows great fear of all animals.

Through Henry J. Carr, manager, and Herman Schultz, orchestra leader, the defense sought to show that it was not guilty of negligence. They declared that the monk was a little clown pet with Padrini's animal act and that it had not caused any trouble at the nine previous performances, when it was accustomed to climb along the railing and accept candy from patrons of the show.

Mr. Schultz admitted that the monkey climbed on his shoulder at most of the performances, but denied that it had jumped on his head. He did not recall having complained to the management about the matter.

Mayor Schwab announced this morning that the law prohibiting operation of jitney buses without certificates from the public service commission will be enforced by arrest of drivers. This does not mean the entire police force will go after the 2,000 or 3,000 jitneymen who are operating, but the law will be enforced to the best of the ability of the police.

"The law is there and must be obeyed," said the Mayor. "I will enforce it. If the people don't like the law it is up to them to vote their opinion next November.

"We now have 600 to 700 of the 1,200 policemen in Buffalo doing special strike duty for the International. That is as much as we can do. I cannot give them any more men.

Pliny B. McNaughton, president of the Shea Amusement company, and for many years prominently identified with the business life of Buffalo, died early today in the John Kelly hospital in Baltimore. His health had been faffling for months.

Mrs. McNaughton was at his bediside when he died. The body will be brought to Buffalo tomorrow.

Mr. McNaughton was born in Buffalo 67 years ago, the son of Daniel McNaughton. After finishing school here he attended Notre Dame university. He later associated with Frank L. Bapst and others in the Buffalo Dredging company. He had been head of the Shea organization, which controls the Shea vaudeville house and all other Shea enterprises, for 10 years.

Mr. McNaughton was largely interested in both. He was manager of the dredging company. The asphalt company, for many years, did much of the paving in Buffalo and the dredging company had numerous large contracts.

James Harrigan, Who Played Before Kings, Is Dead Here

James E. Harrigan, president of the Harrigan Lumber Company, and for many years a tramp juggler, monologist and vaudeville headliner, died last evening at his home, No. 155 Fordham Drive, following a four

155 Fordham Drive, following a four months' illness.

Mr. Harrigan was born in Corry, Pa., December 1st, 1866, and when still a young man he started on his professional career with George Castle in Chicago. His first performance was at the West Side Museum there, acting in a full dress suit. Frequently he and the rest of the performers had to do their turns 22 times a day, working about 12 hours, their supper being brought to them in the theater.

Impressed Harry Brown.

Shortly after his first appearance, he believed that he could interest the people with his juggling act, which consisted of numerous tricks with cigar boxes. He induced Harry Brown, an impressario, to look over his act. Brown was astonished at the trick and told Harrigan that it was just "the thing." From that time on he had no trouble getting bookings at all the theaters. And when he finally garbed himself in the well-known stage tramp costume, his success was assured. The old popular song, "H-A-R-I-G-A-N", is said to have originated from him.

Mr. Harrigan never tired telling of

Mr. Harrigan never tired telling of his experience with the Prince of Wales, later King Edward, at the Palace Theater in London in 1895. This is the way Harrigan used to tell the story:

King Edward Laughed.

"I arrived at the theater late for my turn, all out of breath. I just had time to daub on a little makeup and take my call, feeling rather out of sorts with the world. I started any way, received a laugh, and then by way of a sally I asked the crowd what they were laughing at. This gained another laugh, and I demanded of a portly gentleman in a box, what he was laughing at. This brought the crowd to silence until the portly gentleman, whom I later found out to be the Prince of Wales, laughed heartily. The crowd followed his example and the house was soon in an uproar. Next day I
