Meeting was called at 8.05 P.M. A.H. Rising for Benefit of Prayers. Minutes of previous meeting were approved as Read. Treasurers report as follow was ordered received, and Filed. Income \$ 276.⁹⁸/₁₀₀. Disbursements \$ 222.¹⁹/₁₀₀ leaving a Balance of \$ 54.⁷⁹/₁₀₀. Mr. Rowe said he had contacted Mr. Pitts Regarding Girl Scout Troop. No definite agreement was made yet. Report will be made next meeting. Moved Expense of Delegate to convention be paid. Mr. Brown reported he had paid Bill to Steel Electric for repairing motors. Mr. Brown Promised to have his Committee meet Mr. Fabiano & discuss the work & cost of same, at very Earliest moment so we could discuss the matter with new Bishop & try to get work started. Moved & carried mimeograph be bought if machine be found in good condition by the committee of Miss Irma Rogers & Miss Hoskiss. The matter of Repairing Kitchen and changing outside was brought up. M^r Guaranta said M^r Fabiano was too busy but he had spoken to another man who was submitting a sketch for same. The regular meeting was held in the temporary building of the Church of the Redeemer at 2722 Pine Ave. Rev. G. Charles Rowe presiding. The following mission members were present: Mrs Hill, Mrs Bird, Messrs Brown, Lyall, Harris, Austin, Allison and Marshall. Meeting was called at 8:20 AM.

All present rising for benedictions and Prayers. The Minutes of previous meeting were approved, as read. C. Marshall was duly elected to act as temporarily clerk in the absence of Mr Lyall who was leaving for a wonderful vacation in Sunny California. Treasurer's report as follows was ordered received and filed. Total receipts for January 1949 \$305.74 total disbursements for Jan 1949 255.49 leaving a balance of \$50.25. Mr Rowe spoke on the Bishop's fund radio program to be broadcast Saturday March 26th. The Church of the Redeemer is requested to raise \$54.00 as their quota towards this fund. It was brought to the attention of the Committee that we are badly in need of a Parish Register. Mr Rowe was bringing this before the congregation next Sunday morning to ascertain if anyone would contribute the necessary funds as a memorial. Mr Rowe was pleased to inform the committee that he saw the sketch of our new church. He was reasonably sure the members of the Church of the Redeemer would be very proud when the final plans are complete.

An informal meeting with Mr. Talavico was held after our Mission Committee meeting on what caused the damage to our Church foundation during the winter. Mr. Talavico informed the committee he was at a loss to explain why the wall cracked in several places as we did not have a severe winter. He said the wall has a strong footing because iron rods were used in the footings. The specifications did not call for these, but as an added precaution he took it upon himself to place these rods in the footing when the mix was being poured. He has examined the wall and it is not out of line. Mr. Rowe had a structural engineer from Buffalo examine the foundation and he reports the cracks are not serious. The engineer has instructed Mr. Talavico on what to do. Mr. Talavico assured the committee everything humanly possible would be done by him to correct these defects. He also reminded the committee that last fall when he knew we would be held up for the steel, he recommended to Mr. Lark that he be given

permission to go ahead with a wooden floor instead of concrete at an additional cost to the building. The Diocesan Committee and Mr. Hark insisted upon steel and concrete, therefore they agreed to wait until the steel arrived. Mr. Talpin stated that inasmuch as Mr. Hark recommends him to do he is obligated under the contract to carry out the architect's orders. The committee was informed that after the concrete on the main floor is poured we should be in our church in three months.

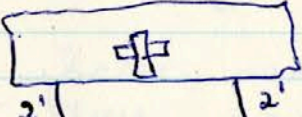
