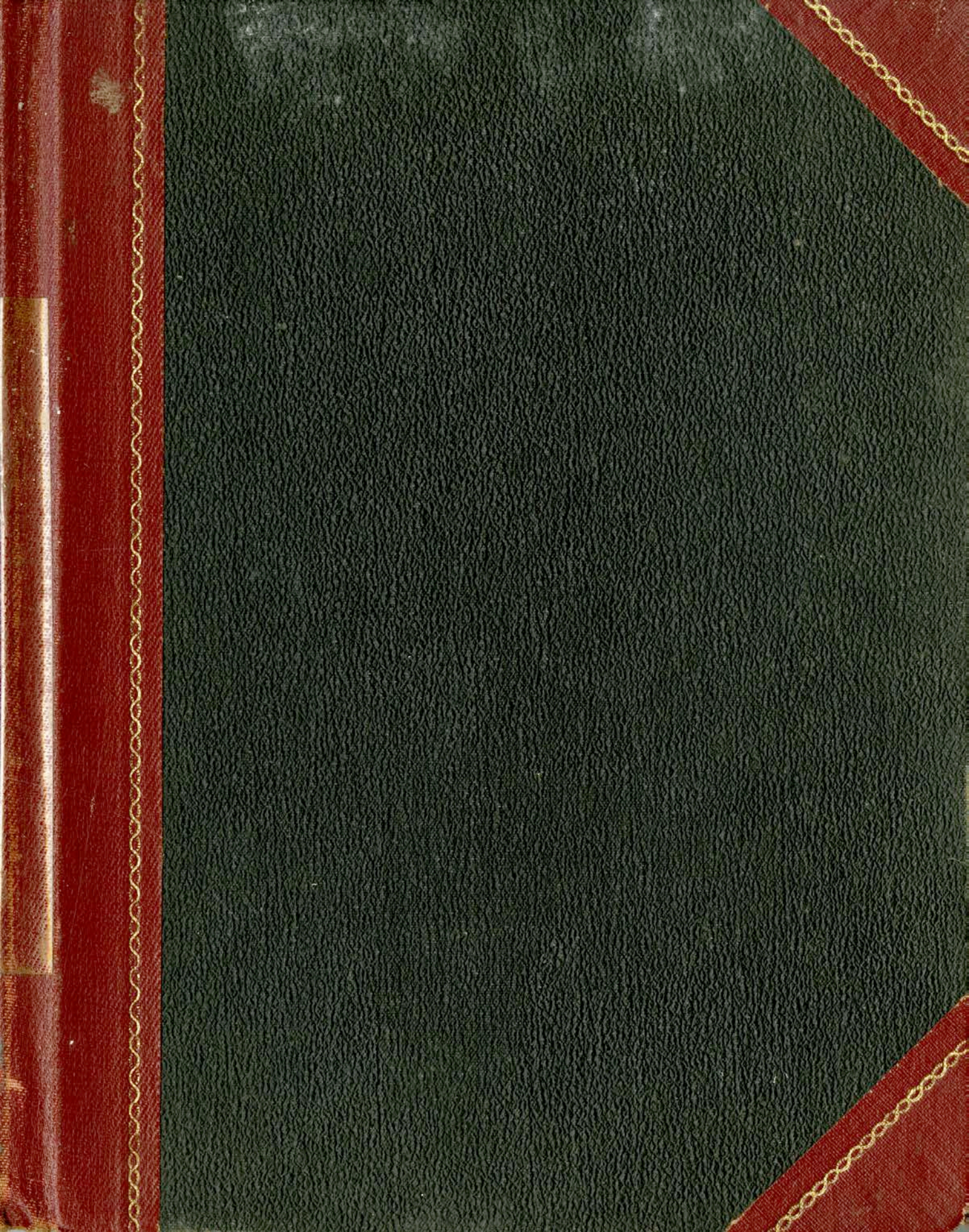

Nov 18, 1968

The advisory council held its regular meeting on Nov 18, 1968.

The meeting started with a prayer by Fr Temple at 7:35 AM.

The minutes of the previous two meetings were read and approved.

Fr Temple gave the treasurer's report. The receipts for the month were \$22.81, with expenses of \$261.82. \$200⁰⁰ of this expense went into the savings account. New balance on hand, \$134.61. Mr Warne moved & 2nd the report be accepted as read.

Fr Temple gave his report for the month on all visitations, burials, and marriages.

There was some discussion on a railing for the Stage. Mr. Monteleone said it would cost approximately \$250⁰⁰ to have a railing and gate installed and painted. Mr. Schuman suggested Fr Temple get a price on the fence and gate also.

The electric range from the old rectory has not been sold and after some discussion, Mr. Monteleone moved we give the range to the City Mission. 2nd by Mr. Rozon. Motion carried.

Mr. Monteleone is having the plaque made out for the Parthex screen.

The Snow Blower has been ordered and is on its way.

The towel dispensers have not been installed as yet.

The step at the side entrance as yet has not been repaired.

The railing for the steps at the vicarage will be installed at a cost of \$650⁰⁰.

Mr. Wright reported on how the pledges stood. There were 103 pledges. 83 actually pledged and 19 took envelopes, without pledging. Total pledged \$11579⁰⁰.

Fr Temple discussed the gentlemen's agreement which was pointed at the 1967 annual meeting.

He said that for something like this to be effective, a resolution would have to be passed before the next annual meeting and be presented to the bishop.

Terms to expire are Messrs Monteleone - Wright and Wente, as councilmen and Mr. Warne as Warden.

Fr Temple feels he would like to keep same Council men during the next term. And asked if they would accept nominations.

The "Grooming committee" will be brought up at the annual meeting.

Fr Temple received a letter about the Diocesan Convention.

The Advent dime cards are being sent out.

The church furnace has been cleaned and repaired.

The proposed budget for 1969 was read over by Fr Temple. Mr. Hooker moved that we accept the budget. 2nd by Mr. Schuman. Motion Carried.

It was suggested that a copy of the budget be available in the office for anyone who wishes to have one.

2 Couples from St. Lukes offered to Fr Temple, to do something for the Church, whatever Fr Temple felt he needs. After some discussion, it was suggested, he mention that he need an office built on to the rectory.

The Annual meeting was held on Dec 2/1968 and started at 7⁴⁵ AM

A motion was made to adopt programs outline

A motion was made to waive reading of last year minutes

Canons were read re: qualifications and terms for officers and voting.

Nominations were then open for Warden. Mr Kysor was unanimously elected.

Nominations were then open for council men after Mr Brown recommended an office of co-warden be created to fill in when the warden is absent. Such a situation is not provided for in Canon law.

Nominations as follows

~~Mr Ellis~~ - Edwin Ellis, Jerry Dickson, Frank Wright, Pat Montelone and Clarena Waite.

The Ballot-box remained open for 1 hour, from 8⁰³ to 9⁰³. The 3 members elected for three-year terms were Frank Wright, Clarena Waite, and Jerry Dickson. Edwin Ellis is an alternate.

Mrs Stevens read the Church School report

Mrs Calquhoun read the Altar guild report.

Mrs Dickson read the Redemptive guild report.

Mr. Lozon gave the Episcopal Charitas report.

\$536 pledged; 96% paid

Mr Wright gave the Every Member Canvass report

Mr Mc Kelly gave the Treasurer's report.

Income for 1968 was \$9422.13, with expenditures of \$8286.13. Budget for 1969 is \$13,393 with anticipated pledges of 11,700. Outstanding on church mortgage is \$7288⁴³. Of this years payment not made yet.

There was a question on payment of Fr. O'Neil's moving bill.

Mr Norton gave the Choir report. He made a request for new members and also for choir robe

cleaning, repair and replacement.

There was some discussion on part played by the women in fund raising and lack of involvement brought up by Mr Brown. It was suggested by Mrs Dickson that men contribute to the Silent Auction in the form and manner of the UTO collection boxes.

Fr Temple gave a report on the state of the Mission

General discussion:

Fr Temple brought up the idea of nominating committee for next and subsequent annual meetings to draw up a slate of Officers to be present at the meeting for election. After some discussion, it was voted in favor of this idea. To be taken up with the advisory Committee

Mr Norton commented on prospects of increasing the congregation and possible effects of urban renewal on down-town parishes.

Fr Temple mentioned neighborhood canvass publicity, the example of the Mission and its members as active and faithful Christians in attracting others to the mission.

Mr Norton asked about card parties as means of fund raising.

Mrs. Schuman commented on failure of last Cant Party and need for general support of such events.

Mr Norton commented on apparent lack of social events sponsored by this Church and the possible attraction value of such events.

Fr Temple commented on planned youth convention planned by Diocese for sometime in the Spring. To plan on reorganization of youth organizations in parishes and missions. Mentioned successful use of college students as youth organization advisors.

Mrs Calphoun spoke of the effectiveness of the youth organization (using college students) at First Baptist Church.
 Fr Temple expressed his appreciation to the outgoing warden, Mr. Worne and members of the Advisory Council.
 The meeting adjourned at 9³⁵ PM.

October 21, 1968

The regular monthly meeting of the Advisory Council was held this date. The Vicar opened the meeting with a prayer. The clerk was absent so that the minutes of the last meeting were not available.

The treasurer reported a balance on the checking account was \$3,583.62.

The Vicar gave the following report of his activities:

Old Business

The matter of installing a railing on the stage was brought up. It was suggested that folding doors might serve the purpose. It was thought that this might be too expensive. Mr. Worne said that he would contact Mr. Monteleone to see what he had done about the matter. At the last meeting Mr. Monteleone said that he would see what could be done.

The Guild does not want the electric range, taken from the old vicarage, installed in the kitchen. It was suggested that the range be sold and that a notice be put in the church bulletin. Mr. M^{rs} Hedy moved that the stove be sold to the highest bidder within the congregation. Seconded by Mr. Hooker.

motion carried.

The council discussed the purchase of a lawn mower and snow blower. Mr. Hooker moved, seconded by Mr. Shuman that a committee of 3 be appointed to look into the matter and if satisfied were authorized to make a purchase. Messrs Culp, Dickson & Wright formed the committee.

New Business

The Vicar mentioned that there was no piscina in the sacristy. The Altar Guild needs one, and are willing to pay for its installation. Mr. Wright moved, seconded by Mr. Dickson that the Altar Guild be authorized to install the piscina. Carried.

Mr. Temple said that paper towel dispensers should be put in the rest rooms.

Mr. Temple announced that Bishop Scaife would make his visitation to our mission on Sunday, Feb. 9, 1969. He will be present at both services. There will be a reception in the undercroft after the 10:30 service. The Bishop wants to meet with the Council and it was agreed that the council would take him to dinner at Howard Johnsons, on Pine Avenue.

The Vicar suggested that we contribute \$25.00 to the bldg. fund of St. Bartholomew's Church in the town of Tonawanda. It was agreed that this would be a friendly gesture and a tribute to our former Vicar, Rev. Russell J. Amend.

Mr. Warner moved, seconded by Mr. Dickson that the Clerk be requested to notify the Vicar if he could not be present at a council meeting - also to see that the minute book was given to the Vicar. Carried.

Mr. Temple said that according to the canon, we must submit to the Bishop an agenda for our annual meeting. In the past the business of the annual meeting was to elect a warden and councilmen also to hear the reports from the various organizations.

The flood light in front of the church is not working and should be checked.

The steps at the side door need repairing.

The Vicar said that a railing is needed at the front entrance of the vicarage also for the steps. Mr. Shuman said he knew a man who does that kind of work and he would get an estimate of the cost. Since this is something that should be done without delay, Mr. Hooker moved, seconded by Mr. Dickson that if the Vicar thought the estimate was o.k., he was authorized to have the work done.

Mr. Boyon moved, seconded by Mr. Culp that the treasurer be empowered to transfer \$2,000.00 from the checking account to either the Niagara County Savings Bank

or the Niagara Permanent Savings & Loan Association, whichever pays the best interest.

Moved by Mr. Shuman that we adjourn.

The following is the listing of the duties and responsibilities of the Finance Committee as outlined at the December 1968 meeting of The Advisory Council.

"Finance Committee--to serve for one year term, January 1st to December 31st--members may be appointed to succeed themselves.

The duties of the Finance Committee will be to prepare a budget for presentation to the Advisory Council at the November meeting each year. In addition the Finance Committee should concern itself with the ongoing financial position of the Mission, it should arrange for the annual audit of the financial records of the Mission, and it should be responsible for the preparation of the Annual Financial Report to the Diocese and National Church (Parochial Report). It should be aware of the percentages of pledges paid as compared with pledges due and it should recommend suitable action to be taken if and when pledge payments begin to decline. It should consider a quarterly financial progress report to the congregation for publication in either the bulletin or a News Letter. It is expected that from time to time, the Finance Committee may make suggestions to the Advisory Council for ways and means of improving our financial situation."

"It is the Vicar's intention to appoint the three newly elected members of The Council to serve on the Property Committee for a period of one year.

The Property Committee will concern itself with all necessary repairs and improvements to the Church and Vicarage. It will recommend to the Council, any major repairs or improvements needed or desired, and it will obtain and submit for Council consideration, the estimated cost of any work to be done by outside contractors or tradesmen.

It is expected that as much as possible, the Property Committee will be able to arrange for volunteer help from the men and older boys of the congregation in the painting, repairs and maintenance of the Church or Vicarage that may become needed.

William Boyon Chairman of the Financial Committee showed us a new chart whereby we can tell at a glance just where we stand each month. Mr. Dickson, as treasurer will fill out a monthly report.

No report from property committee

Fr. Temple & Frank Wright both tried out the new snowblower & found it satisfactory.

In regard to property committee Fr. Bob reported a leakage in the cellar of the vicarage. Fr. Wright contacted a Mr. Quigley who recommended installing drain tile & re-cementing joints or covering walls with polyethylene plastic and allowing water to go into drain or dig around foundation & seal from outside - discussion followed with the result that Donald Culp was going to check with a man he knows & try and get another estimate. Frank Wright was also going to check.

Old Business

Fr. Bob received an estimate from Mr. Clark for the railing for the stage. a wrought iron railing, painted black, 34" high 3 - 6' sec. bolted to the floor able to remove center section or all 3 for \$143.00. Discussion followed with a motion by E. Kypor, seconded by J. Shuman to have railing installed according to diagram shown. Carried

P. Monteleone in process of having samples of plaque for the narthex screen drawn up to be submitted for final approval.

Pisceno has been delivered and Pat Monteleone will see about having it installed.

Fr. Bob appointed David Kenyon as alternate to Diocesan Convention in case Mr. Kypor cannot attend.

Fr. Temple discussed with the Council the serious need of a study for the Vicarage. The Vicar said he would apply the \$333.00 check he received from St. Lukes to the Church mortgage if the Council would make a firm commitment to proceed with construction of the addition to the Vicarage when the mortgage is paid. Discussion of the matter followed with the result that council not ready to make commitment but instead start a building fund & and construct addition to vicarage as soon as we can see our way clear.

Motion so made by D. Culp, seconded by J. Shuman - carried

Jerry Dickson mentioned the need of garbage cans. To keep them from being taken - it was decided to secure them with chain & lock & stencil name on them. E. Kypor motioned that we buy 4 new cans & 25 liners - seconded by J. Dickson - carried & referred to property committee.

We are still waiting for a report from Shirley Oldfield in regards to choir robes.

William Boyer said that the annual mortgage payment is listed in the budget as \$2700 when it is actually only \$2450. He made a motion seconded by E. Kypor that

\$100 be put in a newly created item for Janitorial services & the remaining \$150 be put in the unexpected emergency fund.

New Business

It was agreed that the Council would take the Bishop to lunch when he visits our Church on Feb. 9.

R. Dickson, seconded by J. Dickson made a motion that the spouses of the Council Vicar & Clerk be included. - Carried.

E. Kyeor motioned seconded by W. Royon that Mrs. Dickson take charge & make arrangements at the Treadway if possible. Carried.

Fr. Bob said that it has been suggested that the Council consider changing the meeting night from the 3rd Monday of the month to the second Monday.

Motion made by E. Kyeor to this effect seconded by C. Waite - Carried.

Fr. Bob brought up a suggestion by a member of the congregation as to stationery for the church with letterhead. D. Bane will look into this matter.

Fr. Temple brought to the attention of the Council the importance of having mail contact with people who do not attend church regularly. He suggested that it might be possible to put names & addresses on the Bulletins on a special Sunday and the ones not picked up be mailed to them. W. Royon & D. Bane to see about operation of addressograph.

Fr. Temple also mentioned another matter the need for vestments for the Acolytes. This involves no expenditure

He is going to order 12 red cassocks in various sizes.

Another matter the Vicar brought up concerned the program for Lent. Discussion of said program - Fr. Temple said that there were several films available & that we could for a charge have a discussion after viewing the films. The Council authorized Fr. Bob to go ahead with his Lenten program.

Another matter of interest was a survey of our insurance program - Total premium is now \$426.76. It was suggested that we see what the rates of the Church Fire Insurance Co. are.

Fr. Bob read some correspondence from the Diocese regarding changes in the Diocese House.

A communication from our companion Diocese, British Honduras, asking our Mission to make a pledge of 1% of our anticipated pledged income to assist with scholarships offered to young men going into the priesthood. They would like to hear from us by Feb. 14. Tabled until next meeting.

J. Dickson brought up the matter of painting - What - When & Who. E. Kyeor motioned that the 2 rest rooms, kitchen & back stairway be painted - seconded by J. Dickson. - Carried. referred to property Committee - Meeting adjourned.

The grass cutting schedule is in operation & working very well.

We have received a letter from the Trustees of the Diocese concerning the sale of our vacant lot. The trustees have decided that this lot should be sold. Bishop

Robinson said that we should decide what we want to do & then send a representative to their meeting on May 26. at 4 pm. since

General Discussion followed & the Council has voted not to sell - & our members would be very upset & discouraged if forced to sell. David Kenyon motioned that Fr. Bob & Frank Hornsby go to this meeting & present the position that has been discussed by the Council seconded Ken Norton. Motion carried. Fr. Bob expressed special thanks to Jeri for arranging the very lovely luncheon for Bishop Robinson.
