On Board the Cambridge
In sight of Fort Monroe
June 28th /61

My deers Jennie;

As we will land
in a few minutes I
have but time to say
a few words. I was
quite sea sick part of
the way but I am
well now. On the whole
we have had a pleasant
voyage. The officers of
the ship are very gentle
-manly and attentive.
I can see from here a
Rebel Battery on the
shore - but if they knew
when they are well off
the will let us a- lone

we are ready for them
However, we do not
anticipate any trouble
until we are going
up the Potomac to Wash-
ington. Then we expect
a brush. We have plenty
of ammunition and ^{ammunition} ~~ammunition~~
on board. The next time
I write to you it will
be from Washington
we will be there tomorrow
I have my comfort
Thanks to your kindness
and foresight I would
like to say a thousand
sweet words to you
but I must wait another
opportunity. I mail this
a fort Murre. Some
to funds to Lizzie and
little Angel. God protect
you and me and little
family.
you for now!

The Pembroke just behind - we have
food here in case for the next few
