Log House of Camp
April 6. 1863

My Dear Jennie:

I received the en-
closed letter from Mr
Wilson. An answer has
been sent. You will please
preserve the Senators letter.

I expected to hear
from you tonight. but did
not. Mr. Jennie, dont commene
that imitation of your neglec-
ful husband. While after.

The President was here
to-day receiving this Corps.
I wish you were here darling.
I am down upon Ybooks
for sending the Ladies off-
the wretched old back.

There is no immediate

prospect of a move.

By the way that
"Eneas Smith" has complained
to the Governor about any pun-
ishment of those two deserters,
and the Governor has referred
the matter to my friend Giffen.
I am sorry that the Gov. noticed
that clique of all - but no
matter the deserters have been
punished, and the statement
which I made to Giffen will be
sent to Gov. Andrew who will
read no doubt my opinion of
the North End faction, to Mr. Smith
who will be delighted thereof!
