Would I trouble attention for a short time as to whether or not amongst Divisions, to the Conducting of which you may have frequently been a witness, you have known certain differences to exist about modes of procedure. For instance I have known difficulties to arise relating to an objection to an amendment which being passed was allowed to dispose of a question ^{rightly}, resolution included according to Gresham's Manual which we use, if I understand it the resolution as amended would ~~then~~ immediately follow the acceptance of an amendment. I do not ask in this letter an opinion professionally, but simply to mention one or two features of ordinary debate which you might recall as a Vice officer of the A.O.H. Some precedent or experience, such as I mention being under discussion and leading one & believe were unsettled and disputed measures.

I had an appeal lately from one Division on an Amendment which was ignored by the Chair. I mentally decided that the Chair was right because the amendment had apparently no relation to the original motion and hence partook of the character of a separate motion. When having consulted Gresham's Manual however,

Chapter IX, Sec. IX, paragraph 133 I found what appears to sustain a difference of opinion, viz., that words can be stricken out and others introduced of a "wholly different tenor". I know you must now be busy preparing, "with a ~~modest~~ multiplicity of duties" for the Nat'l. Convention, so if you have not time to give any attention to this letter at present I shall not be disappointed. I thank you for having always kindly answered my communications, although, as I am aware, Constitutionally I should not expect a Nat'l. officer to honor them.




