### A P R O C L A M A T I O N

WHEREAS, Charles F. Horn, City Councilman, attorney, father and cycle enthusiast lives in the age of "not wanting to get involved", and

WHEREAS, said Mr. Horn, possessor of both kind heart and gentle soul, did elect to become involved by accompanying nine 12-year old Girl Scouts on a bicycle trip, and

WHEREAS, neither rain, wind nor creeks could stay him and his fellow pioneers from their appointed paths, and

WHEREAS, nine girls of the adventurous age of twelve can be quite a job for nine fathers, and a real workout for one stalwart councilman:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETTERING, OHIO, that May 25, 1967 be proclaimed Charles F.
