

# **Student Composers**

Hannah Jarvis is studying composition with Dr. Laurence Sherr, and is also a voice student with Ms. Valerie Walters. She is a member of both Chorale and Women's Choir at KSU, and performed with composer Ola Gjeilo at the most recent Choral Ensemble concert. She takes inspiration from Eric Whitacre as well as other 21st century composers. Daphne and Apollo is not only her first piece, it will also be her first piece premiered at KSU. She is currently auditioning to be a Cast Member at Disney World Resort in Orlando, FL. She is also working on her second piece, a string quartet.

Chloe Lincoln is a student in the Bachelor of Arts with a Concentration in Composition degree at Kennesaw State University. Her primary advisor and composition teacher is Dr. Laurence Sherr. She has performed around the US, and appeared in China with the Kennesaw State University Orchestra. She is in her third semester of concentration and in the process of her second work. Her previous piece was Horn Duo, and she has just completed a brass quintet. The Horn Duo was premiered at the KSU Student Scholarship Symposium and then later performed at the Student Composition Recital.

**Joshua Martin,** an award-winning composer, has works that have been performed at KSU, First Baptist Church of Woodstock, and the International Euphonium Institute. Joshua's chamber work entitled *Fanfare to the Creation* won First Place in the 2011–2012 KSU Brass Fanfare Composition Competition, and his collection of excerpts from *Mashiyach* received an Honorable Mention in the 2012–2013 KSU Concerto Competition Composition Contest. The string quartet premiering on tonight's program is his newest work. Mr. Martin studies under composer Jennifer Mitchell.

Michael Terry is a senior Music Education major at Kennesaw State University where he studies euphonium with Bernard Flythe. At KSU, Michael was recently announced a winner of the Concerto Competition and the Composition Contest (for his composition for Wind Ensemble titled *Haiku*). As an arranger/composer, Michael has written for high school marching bands across the country and in China, as well as college chamber ensembles. Since 2010, Michael has been a member of the brass faculty for the Troopers Drum and Bugle Corps, based in Casper, WY, most recently serving as Assistant Brass Caption Head. Michael is also a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia.

**Peter Gustav Westin, II** is working on a B.A. in Music, with a focus in composition. In 2009 he won the first Kennesaw State University Composition Competition with his *Suite in G, for orchestra: III. Framsteg (Rhapsody on Danish and Norwegian Themes)*. He has conducted the premieres of numerous student chamber compositions, his own chamber works, and the premiere of his own arrangement of the Rachmaninoff *Prelude in C# minor*, for brass ensemble, with the KSU Wind Ensemble & the Boston Brass Quintet. Has is also the Secretary of the Nu Theta Chapter of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity.
