

Mary Akerman is a former first prize winner in the Guitar Foundation of America competition and is a frequent performer both as a soloist and with the Akerman-Teixeira guitar duo. She is head of the classical guitar program at Kennesaw State University and is president of the Atlanta Guitar Guild, a non-profit guitar society. She has performed/taught/adjudicated at GFA festivals, the Festival de Guitarra Paracho in Paracho, Mexico, the Festival Intrenacional de Guitarra del Noreste in Saltillo, Mexico, the Southwestern Guitar Festival in San Antonio, TX, the Classical Minds Festival in Houston, and the East Carolina University Summer Music Workshop, and the Columbus Guitar Symposium. She has also performed and taught at Kocaeli University in Ismit, Turkey, as part of a faculty exchange program between KSU and Kocaeli.

Her education includes guitar studies with John Sutherland at UGA and Bruce Holzman at FSU, as well as masterclasses with José Tomás in Santiago de Compostela, Spain. She also performed in the masterclass of Andrès Segovia at the University of Southern California.

The KSU Classical Guitar Ensemble performs a concert each semester as well as playing outreach performances in public schools and other venues. The current members are pursuing degrees in Guitar Performance, Music Composition, Violin Performance, and Biology.
