

Biography

John Thomas Burson, Atlanta-area trumpeter, has pursued his passion for music through a wealth of musical experiences, including performances with the Georgia Symphony Orchestra, Harrower Opera Institute, Atlanta Trumpet League, Greg Howlett, and the Atlanta-based Spectacle Brass. During his study at Kennesaw State University, he studied with Thomas Hooten of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Karin Bliznik of the St. Louis Symphony, and Dr. Douglas Lindsey. He has attended the Sewanee Summer Music Festival, the YMF Balmat National Orchestra Institute, the Boston Brass Summer Music Clinic at Western State Colorado University, and, this coming summer, the Bay View Music Festival near Petoskey, Michigan. For two consecutive years, he was selected as Principal Trumpet in the Georgia Music Educator's Association All-College Band in Savannah, Georgia. In 2014, he was the International Trumpet Guild Sonare Pro Brass Scholarship recipient.

A founding member of Spectacle Brass, Burson recently was a finalist in the Calvin Smith Brass Quintet Competition in Knoxville, Tennessee, and performed with the quintet alongside the Boston Brass at the Crested Butte Music Festival in Crested Butte, Colorado. Committed to bringing innovative brass music to schools and communities, Spectacle Brass has presented educational programs to multiple Georgia band and orchestra programs and regularly provides music for church services, special events, and corporate functions throughout the Southeast, including a recent performance of the *Suite* from Leonard Bernstein's *Mass*. In January 2014, the ensemble received an invitation to perform at the Georgia Music Educator's Association In-Service Conference, an event which draws hundreds of music professionals from around the country.

Performing in venues such as the Cobb Energy Centre, Gwinnett Performing Arts Centre, Bailey Performance Center, and Cox Auditorium at the University of Tennessee, Mr. Burson was a finalist in the National Brass Symposium Orchestral Excerpt Competition and a semifinalist at the National Trumpet Competition. He has also performed in masterclasses with the St. Louis Brass, Chicago Symphony Orchestra Brass Quintet, Christopher Martin, Robert Spano, Vincent DiMartino, and the Boston Brass.
