Robert Cronin, flute

Artist-in-Residence in Flute

Robert Cronin joined the Faculty of Kennesaw State in 2002 and has been Associate Principal Flute with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra since 1999.

Cronin received his Bachelor of Music degree from Northwestern University in Chicago, where he studied with Walfrid Kujala. Cronin went on to win the Principal Flute position in the Knoxville Symphony where he also obtained his Masters of Music degree in Composition from the University of Tennessee. He has also held one-year positions in the Kansas City Symphony and the Milwaukee Symphony.

Cronin is active as a composer. He writes music for a variety of instrumentations, but has focused on works for flute including *Concerto for Flute and Chamber Orchestra* (2009), *Sonata for Flute and Piano* (2010) and *Five Bagatelles for Alto Flute and Cello* (2016) premiered last season at the ASO Pre-Concert Chamber Music Series. The National Flute Association commissioned Cronin to write a work for flute and piano which was used as a required work for the High School Artist's Competition. The piece that resulted was an homage to his teacher, Mr. Kujala, called *Off the Wall*. Information and recordings of these and other of his works can be heard at robertcronincomposer.info.

Since 2007, Cronin has owned and managed a business that produces custom concrete countertops for commercial and residential applications called CounterIntelligence of Atlanta. Examples of his work and more Information may be found at counterintelligenceatlanta.com.

Cronin has two beautiful daughters, is an avid golfer and is fluent in Swedish.

John Warren joined the Kennesaw State University faculty in 2006. After a national search, he was selected as the Professor of Clarinet in 2011.

His previous university affiliations include Armstrong Atlantic State University in Savannah, Georgia, and The University of Nebraska at Omaha. For 15 years, he was the principal clarinetist of the Savannah Symphony Orchestra and prior to that position, the principal clarinetist of the Omaha Symphony.



He served as principal clarinetist of the Des Moines Metro Opera for many summers prior to arriving in Atlanta. At KSU, Mr. Warren teaches studio clarinet, wind chamber music, and woodwind techniques.

Mr. Warren is a member of the Atlanta Opera Orchestra, the IRIS Orchestra of Memphis, TN, as well as performing frequently and recording with the Atlanta Symphony. His playing can be heard on the Telarc, Naxos, Albany, and New World labels.

He has performed as soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra, the IRIS

Orchestra, the Curtis Institute Orchestra, and the Symphonies of Savannah, Omaha, Hilton Head, and Beaufort, SC. As a recitalist and chamber musician, Mr. Warren has appeared at the Aspen Music Festival, the Evian Festival and the Highlands Chamber Music Festival. He performed the American premiere of selections from Kurt Weill's opera *Der Protagonist* in Carnegie Recital Hall. He was a featured recitalist at the International Clarinet Association's 2005 conference.

Originally, from Shreveport, Louisiana, Mr. Warren holds degrees from the University of Cincinnati College/Conservatory of Music and The Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia. His most influential teachers include Donald Montanaro, L. Thomas LeGrand, and Richard Waller.

Peter Marshall, keyboardist, currently holds the Hugh and Jessie Hodgson Keyboard Chair at the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO). He performs on piano, harpsichord, and organ.

Active as an accompanist and coach in Atlanta since 1993, Mr. Marshall has appeared with the cutting-edge contemporary ensemble Bent Frequency,

and in 2004 joined the roster of the Southeastern Festival of Song.



Mr. Marshall joined the faculty of the Georgia State University School of Music in 2001. In addition to teaching accompanying, he is the musical director of the opera workshop during the academic year, and serves as a coach for the Harrower Summer Opera Workshop.

Mr. Marshall has appeared as a soloist with major orchestras in Atlanta, Washington, D. C. (National Symphony),

Richmond, Norfolk (Virginia Symphony), and Columbus, as well as with the chamber groups Hesperus and Folger Consort, and has given solo recitals in the United States and abroad.

Dr. Marshall chaired the organ department at the Catholic University of America from 1984–1993, having previously taught at Duke University and served as its chapel organist. He holds degrees from Oberlin College and Yale University, and studied at the Musikhochschule Lübeck as a Fulbright Scholar.
