Night on the Bare Mountain by Modest Musorgsky, Orchestrated by Nikolay Rimsky-Korsakov

Description included in Rimsky-Korsakov's score of the work:

Subterranean sounds of non-human voices—Appearance of the spirits of darkness, followed by that of Chernobog—Glorification of Chernobog and Black Service—Sabbath—At the height of the sabbath, the distant ringing of a village church bell is heard; it disperses the spirits of darkness—Morning.

Personnel listed alphabetically to emphasize the importance of each part. Rotational seating is used in all woodwind, brass, and percussion sections.

About the Soloist

Charae Krueger



Cellist Charae Krueger is Principal Cellist for the Atlanta Opera Orchestra and the Atlanta Ballet Orchestra. She is Lecturer and Artist in Residence in Cello at Kennesaw State University in Georgia, having been a faculty member since 2005. Ms. Krueger is an avid chamber musician and is a member of the Summit Piano Trio, the Serafin Ensemble, and the KSU Faculty String Trio. She is a regular featured artist at the Highlands-Cashiers Chamber Music Festival in North Carolina. the Grand

Teton Music Festival in Wyoming and at Serafin Summer Music. Her solo and chamber music concerts have been featured at Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, Carnegie and Merkin Halls in New York City as well as on NPR's Performance Today, WABE Radio Atlanta and WGBH Radio Boston. She plays frequently with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and the Charleston Symphony.

Ms. Krueger received her early cello training in Canada at the Regina Conservatory of Music. She received her Bachelor of Music Performance degree from New England Conservatory in Boston as a student of Laurence Lesser and Colin Carr. She also holds an Artist Diploma from the Longy School of Music in Cambridge, MA and continued her training during the summers at the Banff Centre in Canada where she studied with Janos Starker and Aldo Parisot. Ms. Krueger received additional quartet training with the Juilliard Quartet at the Juilliard School.

About the Conductor

Nathaniel F. Parker



Nathaniel F. Parker has conducted orchestras in the United States, Peru, Russia, Poland, England, and the Czech Republic. Equally at home working with professionals and training future generations of musicians, Dr. Parker is Director of Orchestral Studies at the Kennesaw State University School of Music, Music Director and Conductor of the Kennesaw State University Symphony Orchestra, Associate Conductor of the Georgia Symphony Orchestra, and Music Director and Conductor of the Georgia

Youth Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Parker's conducting accolades include being named a finalist for a Conducting Fellowship with the New World Symphony, a semi-finalist for a Conducting Fellowship at Tanglewood, 3rd Place Winner in the London Classical Soloists Conducting Competition, and a Candidate for the Respighi Prize in Conducting; he also received a Citation of Excellence in Teaching from the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association. An active scholar, Dr. Parker's writings have been published by the Conductors Guild and the College Orchestra Directors Association (CODA). He has presented research at the College Orchestra Directors Association's international conference and served as Editor of the Journal of the Conductors Guild.

Parker earned graduate degrees in orchestral conducting from Michigan State University (DMA) and Bowling Green State University (MM). His primary conducting instructors are Leon Gregorian, Raphael Jiménez, and Emily Freeman Brown; other important mentors include Stephen Osmond, Gary W. Hill, and Timothy Russell. Parker also earned a BM in Bassoon Performance from Arizona State University, where he studied with Jeffrey G. Lyman and graduated *magna cum laude*.
