BOARD BUSINESS I/Organization of Latin American Students Speaker:

Bro., Edward Sheehy, FSC, Ph.D., Professor of History, LaSalle University (U.S. Military in the Middle East).

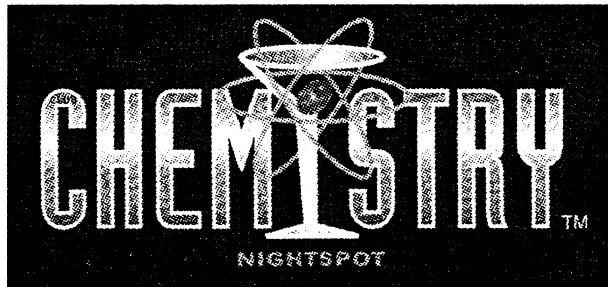
