Dear Leah:

I am writing to you, not knowing if you are the proper person to receive this information, and if not, trusting you will forward it to the appropriate Convention Committee Member. I spoke at some length with Gene Wypyski about 1981 at Disney World but do not know if his resignation would also remove him from the Convention Committee, too.

At any rate, the Contemporary Hotel is available the last week in June, 1981, and could accommodate our group, which I approximated at 1500. They will not take meetings over the July 4th holiday so we would have to be out by that date. I have not checked a calendar to see how this works out.

They can seat 1400 people auditorium style but cannot seat anymore than 960 banquet style in their largest facility. I gave the woman in charge, Ms. Lynette Costello, Convention Sales, a general idea of the program and she assures me that there are ample rooms for meetings and that they would take care of the special requirements ahead of the convention.

Enclosed is the literature she sent me. Please advise me of the proper procedure for getting the necessary details for a proposal, if indeed one is appropriate. Also, please state the deadlines.

Florida law librarians have expressed a desire to participate in hosting the Convention, and at the moment, I am serving as the self-designated spokesperson because of proximity to the resort and staff to commence the preliminary contacts. Please advise me of the next step.

It was good to visit with you at the Convention and particularly on the flight back to Atlanta to talk without interruption.
