## Riding Club



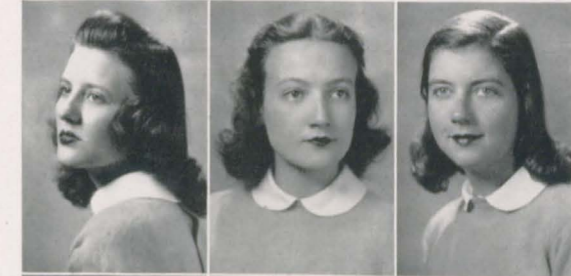
