LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

Trinity College,

Hartford, Connecticut

To the Trustees of Trinity College:

In accordance with Section Three of Article Fifteen of the Statutes of the College, I submit herewith the report of the Librarian for the year ending July 31, 1928.

As in other years, the Library has been kept open fifty-four hours per week; the usual statistics in regard to attendance are given:

No explanation of the smaller total attendance during the past year suggests itself. The number of students was larger than during the preceding year, and the scholastic performance not inferior in quality.

INCREASE OF THE LIBRARY

During the year there have been added to the Library 2516 volumes, 2422 pamphlets, and two manuscripts. Of these 1108 volumes were purchased; all the pamphlets and 1408 volumes were presented. Included in the purchases are 145 volumes of unbound periodicals and 42 volumes paid for by the Departments of Civil Engineering, English, German, Philosophy, and Romance Languages. Of the volumes added to the Library, 1786 are bound and 750 unbound. It should be added that some thirty unbound volumes and most of the volumes of unbound periodicals have already been bound or will be bound during the summer.

The generous appropriation from the income of the Morgan Fund has been most helpful; indeed without it, it would have been impossible to secure the books essential to the work of instruction. A considerable part of the purchases were made to complete the collection of books included in Professor Costello's "List of Books for a College Student's Reading". The Library now has practically all the books on this list shelved separately in the Reading Room. The collection interests not only the students, but practically all who use the Library.

The increasing cost of books makes it more and more difficult to meet the needs of our public. Additional Funds are much needed, especially, perhaps, for the purchase of books and periodicals for the Sciences.

GIFTS

Appendix II gives the names of donors of the year; to these should be added the names of donors of current periodicals given at the beginning of Appendix I. We are again indebted to Mrs. Henry Ferguson, to Dr. Isbon T. Beckwith, to Charles G. Woodward, '98, President Ogilby, Judge Joseph Buffington, '75, and to Professors Bissonnette, Costello, Kleene, Naylor, Perkins, J. A. Spaulding and S. W. Spaulding, and other members of the Faculty for their constant remembrance of the Library.

The largest number of volumes given by an individual donor came from President Ogilby—some hundred useful volumes.

Judge Joseph Buffington, '75, gave a copy of the reprint of the *London Times* making mention of the death of President Washington. William G. Mather, '77, gave six more volumes of the monumental work of the *North American Indian*. The following alumni gave copies of their own books: the Rev. Herbert Parrish, '91; Dr. William Bowie, '93; Daniel Hugh Verder, '99; Henry Irving Skilton, '08; Karl A. Reiche, '09; and Albert E. Hasse, '19. Mrs. Horace Spaulding Brown gave a copy of the elaborate genealogy of the Clement Family (2 vols.) in memory of her father Percival Wood Clement, '68, who was responsible for its publication. Professor Robert B. Riggs gave us forty-three valuable books, consisting largely of recent books of travel and literature. General Preston Brown, LL.D., '26, gave photographic copies of Revolutionary documents, including an orderly book for the period of the encampment of the American

Army at Cambridge, Massachusetts. William Dudley Foulke, of Richmond, Indiana, gave us ten volumes, consisting chiefly of his own valuable publications. The Hon. Clayton R. Lusk gave us a copy (4 vols.) of the famous Lusk Report on Revolutionary Radicalism.

We acknowledge again, very gratefully, the gifts of their publications by the Carnegie Institution, the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, the Smithsonian Institution, the State of Connecticut, and the Government of the United States. We are again indebted to the Connecticut State Board of Education for eight bound volumes of Town reports.

CATALOGUING

The work of the year in this department has been largely devoted to cataloguing recent accessions. In addition, much time has been given to reclassifying and to recataloguing. 2324 volumes not before catalogued have been catalogued and shelved. 519 volumes have been recatalogued and 815 reclassified.

BINDING

As usual, the greater part of the appropriation for binding has been spent in binding current periodicals, including a con-

siderable number of volumes purchased to fill gaps in our sets. However, the small balance enables us to bind some other material. Slowly we are catching up in this highly important work. It is requested that this appropriation be continued.

FUNDS

Again your Librarian calls attention to the pressing need of new Library Funds. A minimum of \$100,000 is needed to enable us to maintain our relative rank among New England college libraries; probably \$200,000 is nearer the mark. With the aid of the appropriation from the Morgan Fund, the continuation of which is requested, we are able to purchase the books most insistently demanded in the work of teaching, though with the increasing cost of books, even that is hardly possible, but we are unable to subscribe for many periodicals much needed. Any plan for the systematic building up of the collection in any field is out of the question. In a word, we live from hand to mouth. Surely at no very distant day the friends of the College will meet this great need.

STAFF

Miss Louise M. Bailey, as Cataloguer, and Mrs. Laura A. Blinn, as Assistant, have continued to give faithful and efficient service.

THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE

The resident members of the Library Committee, President Ogilby and Professor Costello, have as always been most interested and most helpful. The meetings of the whole Committee, though brief and held infrequently, have been valuable and productive of helpful suggestions. It is unfortunate that more time cannot be found for them.

CONCLUSION

The year has been one of routine work chiefly, but also one of real if inconspicuous progress. Our catalogue is more nearly complete than ever before in the history of the Library. We have added a goodly number of much needed and very valuable books to the collection. The stacks on the top floor so long

needed for shelving the Government documents, have been secured. Our greatest need continues to be large additions to our Funds for the purchase of books and periodicals; these we must have if we are to make any systematic attempt to develop the Library. It is encouraging to know that the need is understood and that the friends of the College are alive to the situation. We have faith to believe that this need will be met.
