VA Tutoring Assistance

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Students that can demonstrate a need for tutoring, either with instructor approval or a failed exam, can qualify for additional funding from the VA.

The monthly rate of tutorial assistance may not exceed the cost of tutoring or \$100. The maximum amount payable is \$1,200. There is no entitlement charge for the first \$600 of tutoring services under the Montgomery GI Bill (but not under Chapters 1606 and 1607). There is no entitlement charge under the Post-9/11 GI Bill or DEA. You must be enrolled at the University part-time or more.

Students interested in this funding should apply for it in the Office of Military and Veteran Services. Simply fill out the VA Form 22-1990t and attach any additional documents, such as a letter from your instructor.

The VA Work Study Program

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The Veterans Administration offers students using any kind of VA benefit the opportunity to supplement their income with a part-time office position in a Veteran's Education office, such as the Office of Military and Veteran Services. This position pays untaxed state minimum wage and limits students to 25 hours a week. It's a great way to round out your days on campus and earn extra income.

Vet Success on Campus

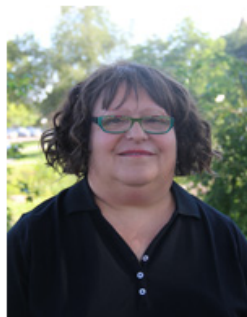
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The Vet Success on Campus (VSOC) program aims to help student veterans and their qualified dependents succeed and thrive at UNO. VSOC does this through on-campus benefits assistance and counseling that leads to the completion of students' education and preparing them to enter the labor market.

VSOC counselors ensure that veterans receive the support and assistance needed to pursue their educational and employment goals. Because VSOC counselors are easily accessible on campus, they help resolve any problems that could potentially interfere with a veteran's educational program, including assisting with disability accommodations. If needed, they can also provide referrals for health services through VA medical centers, community-based outpatient clinics, or vet centers.

VSOC counselors are also Vocational Rehabilitation (Chapter 31) counselors. If you elect to use this benefit, it can be very convenient to work with your counselor right on campus.
