# Additions to the Archive

Among the many exciting new items on microfilm at the Institute are the Disposizione scenica (production book) for the revised Simon Boccanegra and a complete run of the periodical Teatri Arte e Letteratura, published in Bologna from 1824–1862 and offering a remarkably extensive coverage of operatic activities in Italy for the midnineteenth century. This may well be the only set of this rare publication in the Western hemisphere.

Together with numerous piano-vocal scores published in Milan and Naples we have added more than 120 19th-century Verdi librettos, approximately doubling our holdings in this area.

The Archive now also contains excellent films of 154 letters from Verdi to Boito. From the materials on exhibit at the *Macbeth* Congress we have acquired some 70 photographs relating to Verdian biography, as well as a number of set designs and *figurini* (costumes) for Verdi's first Shakespeare opera.

# A Summer Course at the Institute

During the summer of 1978, an intensive three-week course on the music of Verdi will be offered by the Institute's Director, Martin Chusid. Open to both graduate and undergraduate students, as well as special students at New York University, the course will involve the study of librettos and scores in the extensive holdings of the Archive.
