WES WINS

FARESE - TO - NIXON PASS WINS FOR CARDINALS

With 6500 stunned people looking on, Wesleyan's inspired gridders defeated Trinity, 6-3, at Trinity Field this afternoon. Bill Vibert's second-period fieldgoal put Trinity into the lead, but a pass from John Farese to Dave Nixon scored what proved to be the winning touchdown.

First Quarter

Aiken of Trinity kicked off to the Wesleyan 5, where Eggers took it and returned it to the Wesleyan 20. Sardo then made a first down to the 32, but after a series of unsuccessful plays, Brigham was forced to punt. The kick traveled to the Trinity 25, where it went out of bounds.

On the third play, DelMastro made a first down to the 42, and on the next play, Billy Goralski carried to the Wesleyan 34 for another first down. After two unsuccessful runs, Goralski took it to the 20 for another first down. On the next play, DelMastro fumbled, but Vibert recovered on the 23.

DelMastro, Goralski, and Magnoli moved the ball down to the 8, but two plays later Vibert's pass, intended for McElwee, was intercepted by Wesleyan's Sardo, who was stopped on the 25.

The Wesmen then tried a quick kick, which carried to the Trinity 34. After Magnoli lost 2 yards on a running play, Goralski moved the ball to the Wesleyan 46 for a first down.

Following an incomplete Vibert pass play, Goralski again carried, but this time was thrown for a 12-yard loss, back to the 32. Vibert then tried another pass, which was incomplete. Aiken punted, and the ball went out of bounds on the Wesleyan 10. Wesleyan took over, and Farese carried to the 13. At this point, the quarter ended.

Second Quarter

Wesleyan punted from their own 14 to the Trinity 45 where Goralski took it and returned ten yards. Magnoli and DelMastro carried to the 40, and on fourth down Aiken punted to the 15.

Wesleyan couldn't get their offense going, so Eggers booted to the 47, Goralski returning to the Wesleyan 35-yard line. Magnoli and DelMastro carried for four yards, then Goralski took the ball twice for a first down on the 22.

Magnoli hit the line on the next play, but a stone wall named Bob Hardy threw him for a loss back to the 30. Vibert then tried his first two passes of the quarter, both of them sadly incomplete. On the fourth down he passed again, this time complete

to McElwee, but short of a first down and Wesleyan took over on their own 22.

Farese rushed to the 30, was held for no gain by Wentworth and St. Pierre, then quick-kicked on 3rd down 65 yards; the kick rolling dead on the Trinity 7-yard line.

Magnoli and Goralski carried to the 15; then DelMastro made a first down, plowing through a hole opened up by Simmons and Dave Smith, placing the ball on the 19. DelMastro was badly shaken up on this play when Bachman tackled him, but he continued playing.

Magnoli broke through the line on the next play, galloping 47 yards to the Wesleyan 35 before a daring shoe-string tackle by Dave Nixon brought him down. Goralski and Vibert carried to the 27, then Goralski made the first down.

DelMastro made five yards, then he and Magnoli were stopped dead on the 21 by Art Spada and the 61-yard march was ended.

Farese tossed to Dave Jenkins, who stole the ball from two Trinity defenders on the 33. Farese passed incomplete, then John Brigham passed to Eggers, sliding on the ground.

Wesleyan did not have a first down, however, and when Ed Palmer blocked the kick Trinity took over on their own 47. With less than a minute to go, Vibert passed long twice, both incomplete. He then tossed a flat pass to Magnoli, who carried it to the 40-yard line as the half ended.

Third Quarter

Wesleyan kicked off to the Trinity

30, where Aiken returned for Trinity to the 40. Magnoli then lost three yards, but Vibert's pass to McElwee got Trinity to the 45. DelMastro then made a first down to the 50, but after three running plays, by DelMastro and Goralski, Aiken was forced to punt. The ball was taken by Sardo on the Wesleyan 6, and he ran it to the 16.

After a running play had gotten the Cards to the 23, a Brigham-to-Keleher pass went to the 29, and Keleher carried it to the 38, for a first down. But the Trinity defense, headed by Roger St. Pierre, tightened up, and Wesleyan was forced to punt. Farese's punt went to the Trinity 36, and DelMastro took it back to the 43.

DelMastro then made a first down to the 47, but Vibert's pass was intercepted by Nixon, who returned it to the 47. Wesleyan was set back by a 15-yard clipping penalty, and on the next play, Moll's fumble was recovered by Trinity line-backer John Wentworth.

DelMastro and Goralski carried, and Goralski made a first down on the 15. Trinity moved to the 13, at which point Vibert kicked a field goal to make the score Trinity 3, Wesleyan 0.

Aiken kicked off for Trinity, and the boot went to the Wesleyan 7, where Sardo took it and returned to the 25. A quick kick by Farese went to the Trinity 46 and was downed at that point.

Goralski carried to the Wesleyan 46, and DelMastro made a first down to the 42. Magnoli then took it to the 37, and after a no-gain run by DelMastro, Goralski made a first down to the 30. At this point the quarter ended.

Fourth Quarter

This quarter, called impossible by pre-game prognosticators, opened simply enough with two line bucks by Vibert and DelMastro, carrying to the 27. Magnoli broke through for a first down on the 20, but a holding penalty forced the Trinity team back to the 40.

Aiken kicked to the 23, and John Farese, the 185-pound junior took over. Running from the double wing

formation, he carried to the 35. After two plays and an incomplete pass, Farese faked a kick and ran to the Trinity 47 for a first down. This was the first time in the game that Wesleyan had entered Trinity territory. Farese skirted end for another first down on the 37. Switching to the T-formation, Frank Soule ran the ball to the 33. Here Farese took the pass from center, faded back five yards, and lofted a long aerial that Nixon took in stride on the seven and easily carried across.

After a five-yard penalty for too much time in the huddle, Americo Sardo missed his first conversion of the year, and the score read 6-3.

DePatie returned the ensuing kickoff to the 25. After Goralski lost a few yards, DelMastro hit tackle and kept going for a first down on the 4. Magnoli and DelMastro gained only a few yards, and after Aiken dropped a pass when he was hit hard, he booted a low, bounding kick that stopped dead on the Wesleyan 17.

Farese carried to the thirty, and then ran again to the 43. Here the offense was halted for three plays and with one yard to go on last down, Farese kicked, Goralski returning to the 35.

Vibert's pass was intercepted by Ernie Eggers, but again Wesleyan could not get going and the punt went to the Trinity 20.

Vibert passed incomplete three

times, and Aiken kicked to the 50. Nixon carried for a first down, then Wesleyan was forced to punt and Goralski returned to the 25. Vibert's pass was again intercepted by Eggers, and the Cardinals, with less than a minute remaining, ran the clock out.

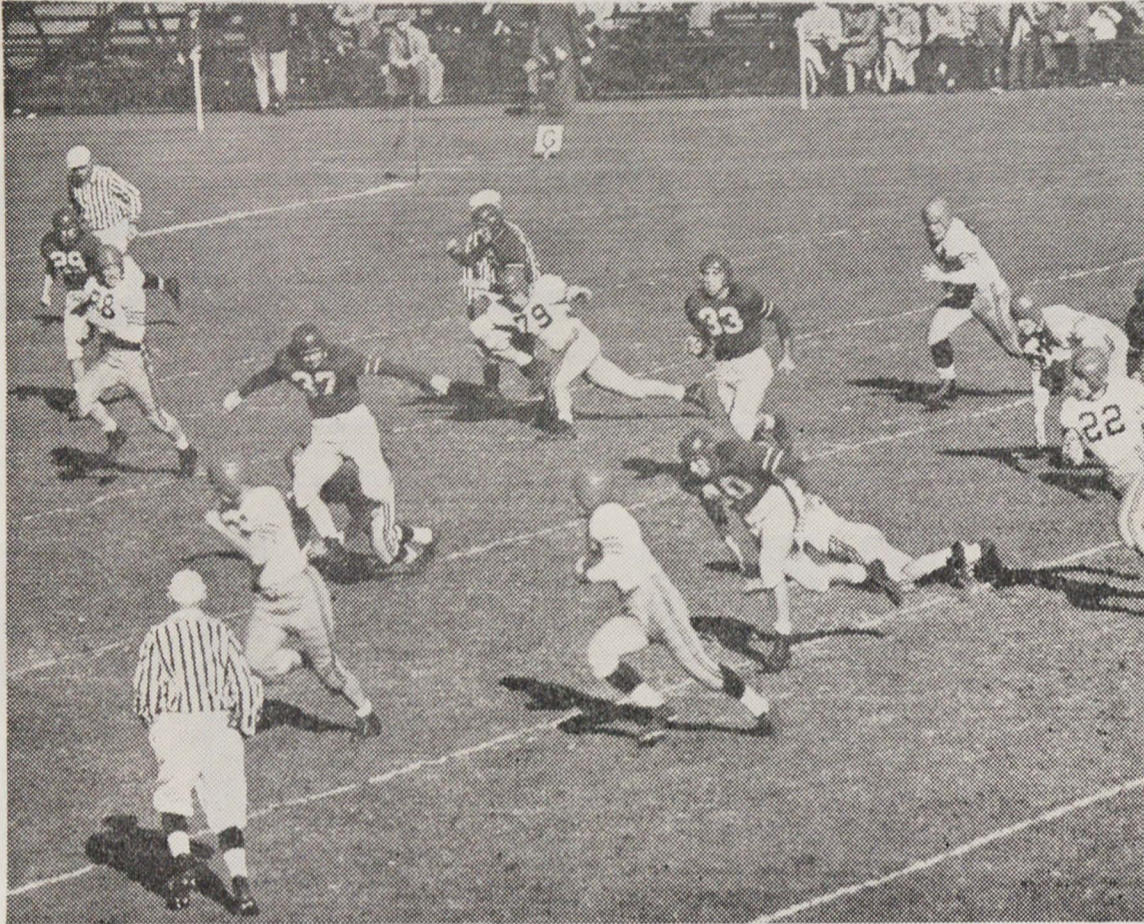

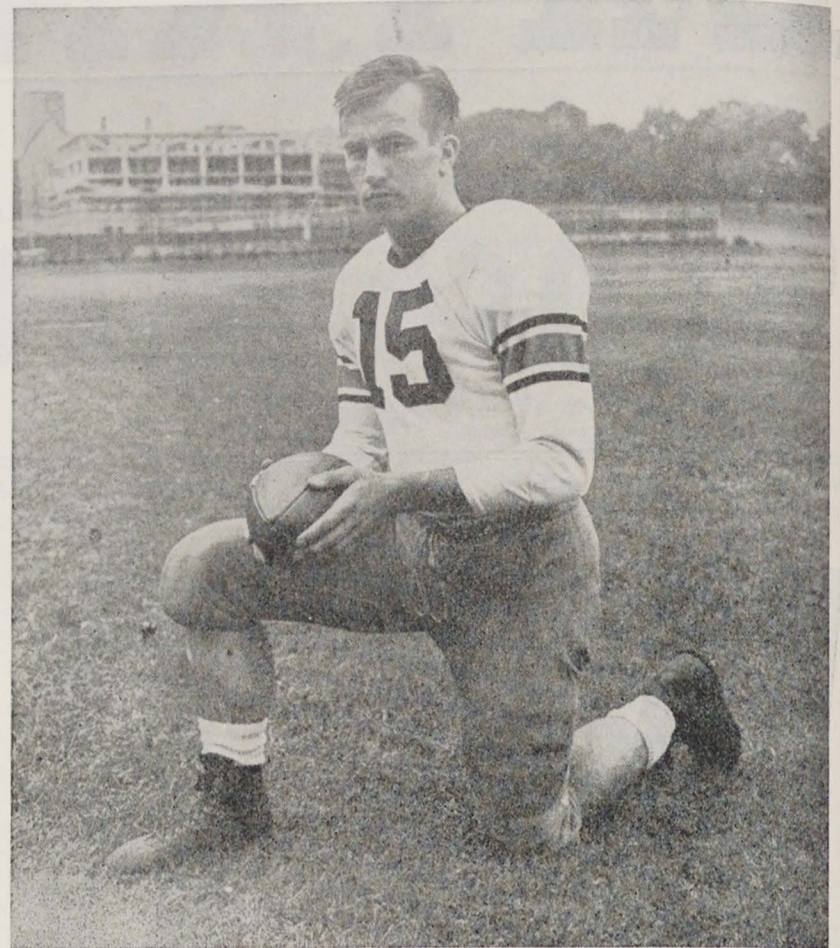

Trinity's 1951 Captain

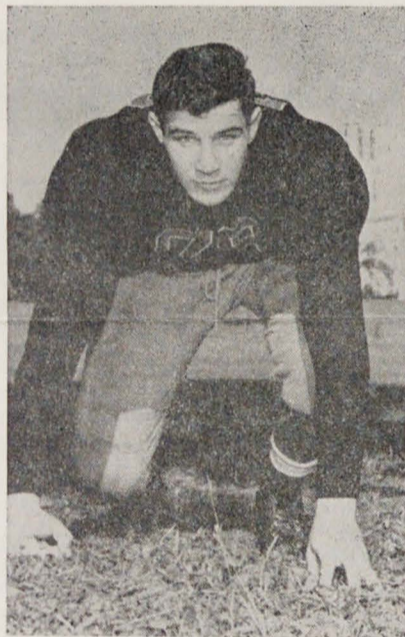


Bill Goralski, captain of the 1951 Hilltoppers, played his final home football game today to end a brilliant four-year college career.

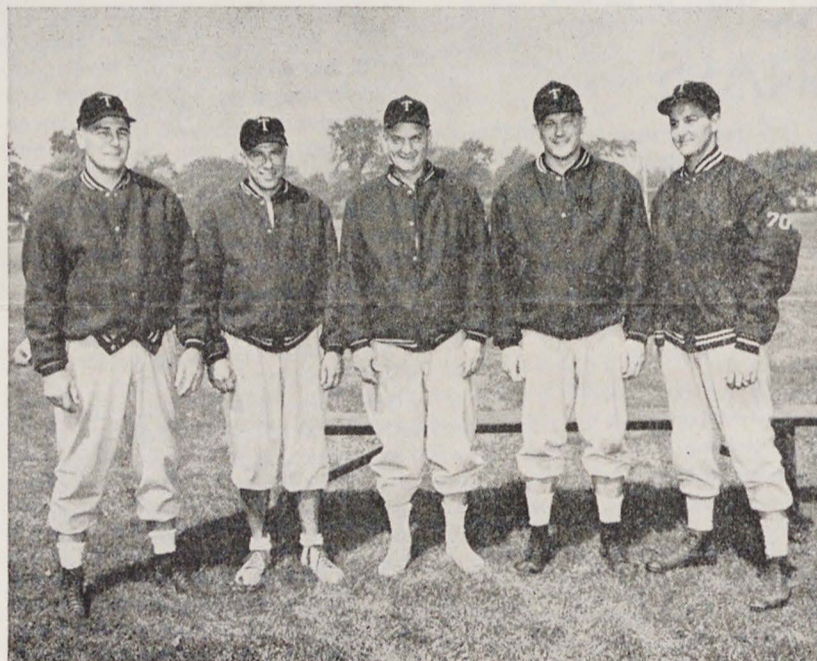
