### Definitions of Institutions

**Institutional System.** A complex of two or more institutions of higher  
education, each separately organized or independently administered,  
under the control of a single administrative body.

**Multi-Campus Institution.** An organization resembling an institutional  
system, but clearly designated as a single institution with either of two  
organizational structures: (1) an institution having two or more campuses  
responsible to a central administration (which central administration may  
or may not be located on one of the administratively equal campuses)  
or (2) an institution having a main campus with one or more branch  
campuses.

**Main Campus.** In those institutions comprised of a main campus and one  
or more branch campuses, the main campus (sometimes called the parent

institution) is usually the location of the core, primary, or most compre-  
hensive program. (Unless the institution-wide or central administrative  
office for such institutions is reported to be at a different location, the  
main campus is understood to be the location of the central administrative  
office.)

**Branch Campus.** A campus of an institution of higher education which is  
located in a community different from that of its parent institution, that  
is, beyond a reasonable commuting distance from the main campus of the  
parent institution. To be considered a branch campus, rather than an  
extension center, the educational activities at the location must be organiz-  
ed on a relatively permanent basis (i.e., have a relatively permanent ad-  
ministration) and include course offerings for one or more complete  
college-level programs of at least one full year.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

This survey constitutes an integral part of the comprehensive nation-wide system of basic data on higher education—the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS)—collected by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). As such it collects and reports basic data widely used by administrators, planners, researchers, and guidance counselors in education.

This form, new last year, incorporates the new classification of instructional programs adopted by NCES. A complete description of this classification is contained in the publication, *A Classification of Instructional Programs*, published by NCES and available from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. Copies were sent to every Registrar and Director of Institutional Research listed in the 1980-81 edition of the *Education Directory: Colleges and Universities*. The racial/ethnic data are required on the form this year, but will not be mandatory next year.

### MANDATORY VERSUS VOLUNTARY REPORTING

**Mandatory Reporting.** Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 requires that services and benefits provided by recipients of Federal financial assistance be offered without regard to race, color, or national origin. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 requires that, with certain exceptions, the services and benefits of federally assisted educational programs and activities be offered without discrimination on the basis of sex. This report is one indicator utilized by the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) in carrying out its responsibilities to verify compliance with Title VI and Title IX.

This report is to be completed in its entirety, and signed, by all institutions of higher education that receive, are applicants for, or expect to be applicants for, Federal financial assistance as defined in the ED Regulation implementing Title VI (45 CFR 80.13), or as defined in any ED Regulation implementing Title IX. If your institution does not fall into any of these categories, please inform us of this fact.

Section 80.6(b) of the Regulation implementing Title VI (a portion of which is set forth below) and similar provisions of the Title VI Regulations of other Federal agencies, authorize collection of this information.

#### "80.6 Compliance information

##### (b) Compliance reports

Each recipient shall keep such records and submit to the responsible Department official or his designee timely, complete and accurate compliance reports at such times, and in such form and containing such information, as the responsible Department official or his designee may deter-

mine to be necessary to enable him to ascertain whether the recipient has complied or is complying with this part."

**Voluntary Reporting.** Those institutions to which these regulations do not apply are not required to complete this questionnaire, which is authorized by law (P.L. 93-380). However, it is hoped that institutions not subject to the provisions of Title VI and Title IX will voluntarily complete all portions of the survey (or at least all except the racial/ethnic data portions) as they have done in the past. Doing so will enable the National Center for Education Statistics to continue to publish complete data on earned degrees for the Nation, the States, and individual institutions.

### RECORDKEEPING

As part of an order in the Adams Vs. Califano litigation entered against the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare in December 1977, the Office of the Secretary of this Department must advise institutions receiving Federal financial assistance that they are required to keep copies of completed surveys on file and make them available to the public on request. (Order, December 29, 1977, K. 28. and p. 20-21.)

It has been determined that the Degrees and Other Formal Awards Conferred Between July 1, 1982 and June 30, 1983 falls under the order's requirement for retention of copies and public release of data if requested. Other surveys that are part of the enclosed Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) package are not subject to the above stipulations because they do not contain information required by the Office for Civil Rights.

**DEGREES AND OTHER FORMAL AWARDS CONFERRED BETWEEN JULY 1, 1982 AND JUNE 30, 1983  
INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THIS FORM**

**1. ORGANIZATION OF THE FORM.** This form is organized differently than the form used by NCES to report degrees and awards in the past. It is used by 4-year institutions and consists of Parts A and B. In Part A, all degree levels of a field of study are contained on a single line, which allows for reporting of associate's, bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees. First-professional degrees are reported in Part B, and Part C has been deleted from this form.

**2. INCLUSIVE DATES.** Report only those degrees which are actually conferred between July 1, 1982 and June 30, 1983. Degrees earned but not yet conferred during this time period should be reported in next year's survey.

**3. INSTITUTIONAL COVERAGE.** A separate report is requested from each branch or member of a system, as well as from each entirely independent institution and each "parent" institution. Please provide the information requested in item 5 of the cover page, which is intended to permit complete identification of the reporting unit. Do not include degrees conferred by branches of your institution located in foreign countries.

**4. CONSULTATION ON PROBLEMS.** If clarification of the definitions and instructions is needed, please consult the Survey Director, Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics, 400 Maryland Avenue, S.W. (Mail Stop 1001, Attention: HEGIS), Washington, D.C. 20202. Or you may reach the Survey Director by telephone: (301) 436-6425, between 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM, EST or EDT.

**5. RETURNING FORMS.** Unless otherwise instructed by the coordinating agency in your State, completed forms should be addressed: Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics, 400 Maryland Avenue, S.W. (Mail Stop 1001, Attention: HEGIS), Washington, D.C. 20202.

**6. MAJOR CHANGES.** If degrees were conferred for the first time in 1982-83 in a program new to your institution, please indicate by circling the "code number" in Column (1). If your institution now awards degrees at a different level in a program in which you awarded degrees prior to 1982-83, please circle the cells in the appropriate degree fields.

**7. SKIPPING INAPPLICABLE FIELDS OF STUDY.** Skip those fields for which your institution does not grant degrees or awards. Please indicate by circling the appropriate page numbers in the "Contents" the fields in which your institution granted degrees or awards.

**8. TYPES OF AWARDS.** Report earned certificates or diplomas below the baccalaureate, as well as associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctor's and first-professional degrees. DO NOT report honorary degrees.

**9. NUMBER OF DEGREES AND AWARDS.** Report all degrees and awards (within the limitations of paragraph 8, above). If a student earned 2 degrees or awards of different levels between July 1, 1982 and June 30, 1983 (e.g., a bachelor's degree at the end of the summer session and a master's degree at the end of the following academic year), report each of the 2 awards in its appropriate classification.

**10. AWARD LEVELS.** The following definitions apply to the award levels identified in this form.

*a. Postsecondary Certificates or Diplomas (less than 1 year).* This is a program that would be completed in less than 1 academic year (2 semesters or 3 quarters) by a student enrolled full time, as full time is defined by the reporting institution, regardless of how long the student has attended the institution.

*b. Postsecondary Certificates or Diplomas (1 but less than 4 years).* This is a program that takes more than 1 academic year by a student enrolled full time, institutionally defined, and in which the completer did not receive, nor is eligible for, an associate's degree or a bachelor's degree.

*c. Associate's Degrees.* This is a degree normally given after at least 2 but less than 4 years of full-time college work.

*d. Bachelor's Degrees.* Normally requires at least 4 but not more than 5 years of full-time college-level work. Also, report ALL bachelor's degrees conferred in a COOPERATIVE or WORK-STUDY PLAN or PROGRAM. A cooperative plan provides for alternate class attendance and employment in business, industry, or government; thus, it allows the student to combine actual work experience with his college studies. Include bachelor's degrees in which the normal 4 years of work is completed in 3 years.

*e. Masters's Degrees.* The master's degree in liberal arts and sciences is the degree customarily granted upon successful completion of at least 1 but not more than 2 full-time academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree. Except for the Master of Divinity degree (Part B), report all master's degrees in Columns (11) and (12) (even though the master's is required in some fields, such as Library Science, Hospital Administration, and Social Work, for employment at the professional level, and even though, as in the case of Social Work, 4 years of undergraduate work are required for entrance into the program and an additional 2 years for completion.) Report Education specialist (6-year degree) in same columns as master's degrees, in appropriate discipline specialty in Education, new CIP code number 13.

*f. Doctor's Degrees.* The doctor's degree classification includes such degrees as Doctor of Education, Doctor of Juridical Science, Doctor of Public Health, and the Ph.D. degree in any field whether Agronomy, Food Technology, Education, Engineering, Public Administration, Ophthalmology, Radiology, etc. (*In the case of the Doctor of Public Health, the prior professional degree is generally earned in the closely related professional field of medicine or of sanitary engineering.*)

*g. First-Professional Degrees.* See instructions in Part B.

**11. SHADED AREAS.** Where NCES anticipates that no awards will be made at a particular level within a program field, that area is shaded on the form. However, new awards are being developed annually. If your institution makes awards at a level shaded on the form, enter the appropriate number in the shaded cell and attach an explanatory note. This will avoid having an editor call you for an explanation later. By doing this you will assist NCES in identifying areas where the shading should be lifted for the following year.

**12. CLASSIFICATION OF DEGREES ACCORDING TO MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY.**

*a. Specific Classification.* Classify degrees as specifically as the list of programs in the broad discipline division of the report form permits. Thus, report a bachelor's degree in business administration with an accounting major in Accounting (06.0201), NOT in Business and Management, General (06.0101).

*b. Degree of Doctor of Philosophy.* Classify the Doctor of Philosophy degree according to the student's major field of study. Thus, a Ph.D. in Chemistry should be reported as a degree in Chemistry, NOT as one in Philosophy.

*c. Majors of Students Prepared to Teach.* The general rule is to classify degrees according to the major area of specialization. This means, in general, that degrees of students who are qualified to teach an academic subject, such as English, biology, or foreign languages but did not go through a program solely for that purpose, should be reported respectively in Letters, Biological Sciences, and Foreign Languages and NOT in Education. On the other hand, the degrees of students who have gone through a program that is specifically preparing them to teach special subjects, as agriculture, art, music, etc., should be reported in Agricultural education (13.1301), Art education (13.1302), and Music education (13.1312, etc.), under Education.

d. *Split Major*. When a student graduates with a split major, report the degree in the area of greater specialization, if possible. If this is not possible, the degree should be reported in the program closest to the combination. If a split major involves two languages, report it in 16.0101, Foreign Languages, Multiple Emphasis. Similarly, within each of the other discipline divisions, if a split major involves two specialties within a division, the degree should be reported under the appropriate "general" specialty indicated under that discipline heading. For example, a major in history and political science should be reported under 45.0101, Social Sciences, General. If the split major covered more than one discipline division, the degree should be reported in the area of greater specialization. DO NOT REPORT FRACTIONS OF A DEGREE.

e. *Double Majors*. When a student graduates with a major in two program areas, report the degree in the field in which the degree was awarded. If the student received two degrees, report only one—in the field of greater specialization, if possible.

f. *Unlisted Fields of Study*. When classifying a program which does not seem to fit into the list, the institution has two choices: (1) the program can be listed by name under "other" if it is listed, or (2) it can be placed in a "general" category if it covers several listed programs. Do NOT erase or change any titles of a program.

Programs are coded by 6-digit numbers. Key punching is done according to code number and any manual change would result in improper coding.

g. *General Majors*. The term general major is used to designate diversified curriculums within an area of study. Ordinarily, degrees based on a general major should be reported in one of the general categories of the report form, such as Physical Sciences, General (40.0101); Social Sciences, General (45.0101); Mathematics, General (27.0101); etc. Thus a degree based on a concentration in History-Government Economics should be reported in Social Sciences, General.

h. *Interdisciplinary Studies*. The codes in the 24 and 30 groups are for reporting fields of study which represent two or more broad discipline divisions. Specify the name of the Multi-Interdisciplinary study when reporting in 30.9999.

13. **RACIAL/ETHNIC DATA**. In Part A, racial/ethnic summaries are requested for each discipline division. In Part B, the number of degrees in each first-professional field should be shown by racial/ethnic category. Racial/ethnic data will not be requested on next year's form. However, State education agencies, central system offices, and other units that ordinarily would be collecting these data anyway may use this form for that purpose. Racial/ethnic designations as used in this survey do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. For the purpose of this report, a student may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded in the community as belonging. However, no person may be counted in more than one racial/ethnic group. In addition, non-resident aliens, i.e., those members of the aforementioned groups who have not been admitted to the United States for permanent residence, should be separately identified as a sixth category; the non-resident aliens are not separately requested by racial/ethnic group, but only in totals.

The definitions for these categories are:

**Non-Resident Alien**. A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Resident aliens, who are not citizens or nationals of the United States and who have been lawfully admitted for permanent residence (*and who hold alien registration receipt cards - Form I-551/155*), are to be reported in the appropriate racial/ethnic categories along with United States citizens.

Non-resident aliens are to be reported separately, on the lines provided, rather than in any of the five racial/ethnic categories which follow.

**Black, non-Hispanic**. A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

**American Indian or Alaskan Native**. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America, and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

**Asian or Pacific Islander**. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example, China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, and Samoa.

**Hispanic**. A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

**White, non-Hispanic**. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

The manner of collecting the racial/ethnic information is left to the discretion of the institution provided that the system which is established results in reasonably accurate data. One acceptable method is a properly controlled system of post-enrollment self-identification by students. If a self-identification method is utilized, a verification procedure to ascertain the completeness and accuracy of student submissions should also be employed where feasible. In order to provide reasonably accurate data, the institution may require students to complete a questionnaire and/or identify themselves by name or otherwise when providing information. The fact that the information is being gathered in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 indicates that it may be disseminated in the manner and to the extent that the institution deems appropriate.

14. **CHECKING**. This form was designed to simplify the checking to see that both the discipline specialties and the racial/ethnic categories add to the total for a division. By adding down the specialty lines and up the racial/ethnic lines, both should result in the same division totals. Please be sure that these additions are verified prior to returning the form. This will reduce the need for this office to ask for clarification later.
