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

Annual Report of the General Hospital Society of Connecticut and the New Haven Dispensary 1936–1937

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To the Directors of the General Hospital Society of Connecticut:

IT is our custom, as you know, to carry our accounts in three units under the following heads:

New Haven Hospital William Wirt Winchester Memorial Hospital New Haven Dispensary

The auditors' statement shows that the New Haven Hospital operated at a loss of \$54,981.37 compared with a loss for the year ending June 30, 1936, of \$21,043.33, an increase in operating loss of \$33,938.04. The Dispensary incurred a loss of \$40,355.22 as compared with a loss of \$42,458.11 for 1936, a reduction of \$2,102.89. The total loss falling on the New Haven Hospital for the year 1936–37 was \$95,336.59, an increase of \$31,835.15 for the year ending June 30, 1936. This deficit was met in part by a contribution of \$90,000.00 from Yale University, the balance of \$5,336.59 being charged to unrestricted principal account of the New Haven Hospital. The Winchester Hospital showed a loss of \$17,287.49 compared with \$24,953.80 for the previous year. This loss was charged against principal of special funds held for the Winchester Hospital by the New Haven Hospital.

The funds of the New Haven Hospital were increased during the year by legacies, subscriptions, and gifts amounting to

\$69,903.74.

The amount of service rendered by the Hospital during the year has again shown an increase, and for the purpose of comparison it is interesting to note the following record of total patient days:

In January a special committee of the Executive Committee was appointed to survey the operations of the Hospital, and, as a result, certain groups of our workers were granted increases in pay, and a further study ended in a general adjustment of wages throughout our service group, which was adopted in June.

A new salary scale for nurses was presented by Miss Grant, Director of Nursing Service, and approved by Dean Taylor, of the Yale School of Nursing. This was adopted by the Executive Committee, and, it is hoped, will enable us to maintain a sufficient staff of graduate nurses to continue the high standards of nursing during a time when demands on our Hospital service seem to be

continually increasing.

The cost of operating the Dispensary is still a financial problem. Every effort is being made to collect the small fee charged, but most of the cost has to be met through contributions from the endowment funds of the Hospital and from Yale University. It is felt that the Dispensary continues to be of great service to the community, and it is interesting to recall that approximately 25% of the patients admitted to the Hospital have previously had Dispensary treatment.

The cost of care for State cases shows a loss of \$44,000, from which may be deducted the State appropriation of \$20,000. We believe that the State should pay for the entire Hospital cost of State cases and an effort was made at the last session of the Legislature to clarify the situation. As a result, the rate paid by the State for hospitalization was increased from \$4.00 a week to \$8.00, effective July 1, 1937. As our cost per week is \$46.75, we are justified in working for a much larger participation by the State, although we are appreciative of the present increase.

William Wirt Winchester Memorial Hospital has been operated to capacity during the past year and has been ably managed by Dr. Soper. During the summer Camp Happyland, a day camp for tubercular children, was directed by Miss Elizabeth Cooper with customary success. One hundred children were admitted, and the daily average census was 79. As usual, the Woman's Committee was active in its assistance to Miss Cooper and contributed \$1,500 for the benefit of the children at the Camp and in the Hospital. Further contributions were made to the Camp from the City of New Haven, the New Haven Kiwanis Club, West Haven Woman's Club and Employees Tuberculosis Relief Association.

The medical care of patients under the skillful direction of the Medical Board has been of the best in spite of crowded wards, and much credit is due Dr. Blake and his associates. We have been particularly fortunate in having Dr. John Homans from Boston in charge of the surgical services during Dr. Harvey's absence. Dr. Homans, an able surgeon, proved also a valued counsellor, and his spirit of coöperation combined with his attractive personality brought him many friends.

We are glad again to extend our thanks to the many volunteers who have worked under Miss Rice in the Medical Social Service Department; to the members of the Children's Recreation Committee for their work with children in the wards and Dispensary; to the Board of Lady Visitors for the holiday gifts to patients and personnel and for the decoration of the Hospital at Christmas time; and to the Committee of Visiting Clergymen.

The year has been one of the most difficult in the Hospital's history, and the appreciation of the Directors is due to Dr. Albert W. Buck who, with his loyal staff, has carried the heavy re-

sponsibility of operating our large institution.

We have made an examination of the balance sheet of

THE GENERAL HOSPITAL SOCIETY OF CONNECTICUT

as at June 30, 1937, and of the summary of expenses and income for the year ended June 30, 1937. In connection therewith, we examined or tested accounting records of the Society and other supporting evidence, and obtained information and explanations from officers and employees of the Society; we also made a general review of the operating and income accounts for the year, but we did not make a detailed audit of the transactions.

The securities shown on the books were in agreement with those shown on certified lists submitted to us by The Union & New Haven Trust Company as custodian. The funds investments consisting of stocks, bonds, etc. are shown on the balance sheet at cost or at amounts assigned by the Treasurer at date of receipt. The aggregate amount of \$3,653,889.03 shown on the balance sheet for stocks and bonds was less than the approximate amount based on June 30, 1937, market quotations.

The plant assets are shown at book amounts, which, except in the case of the Winchester Hospital laundry, are before providing for depreciation. No amount is included for certain buildings constructed by Yale University and occupied by New Haven Hospital.

It was impracticable for us to obtain direct confirmation of gifts shown by the records as having been received for capital and current funds during the year ended June 30, 1937. We have not undertaken to ascertain that provisions affecting gifts have been observed.

In our opinion, based upon such examination and subject to the foregoing comments on plant valuation and gifts, the accompanying balance sheet and related summary of expenses and income fairly present the position of the Society at June 30, 1937, and the results of its operations for the year.
