reference group Any group, including general social groupings based on demographic similarities (e.g., race or culture), that individuals use as a basis for SOCIAL COMPARISON. People determine their own social worth by comparing their personal qualities and accomplishments to the characteristics and achievements of the typical member of the identified group.
