
Figure 3: Headline from The Guardian website dated July 22, 2018






Give 'em what they want




Figure 9: Snippets of email newsletter QuickTips from Booklist.




Figure 18: Snippet view of author record in Novelist Plus database.




Figure 18: Snippet of email from ARLS listserv.


