## **Make Us New**

How's your walk with God? I ask because I really care. Perhaps you made a New Year's resolution to spend more time with Him? How's that going? Maybe you dove headfirst into a ministry opportunity you're excited about leading or engaging in this semester? Or maybe you and God haven't been on good terms for quite a while.

Read Isaiah 35:5 and meditate on these words for just a moment: **“And when he comes, he will open the eyes of the blind and unplug the ears of the deaf.”**

Did anything stand out to you? What might God want to reveal to you as you contemplate these words?

I confess when I first read these words I thought: *I'm not blind or deaf, this passage doesn't apply to me.* But as I sat still and quiet for a few minutes I finally heard God's voice speak to me above my own thoughts: *You're right, you're not deaf but you might as well be because you have not been listening for, listening to, or accepting the things I have to say about you.*

Without God we are all blind and deaf. His word is a “lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path,” (Psalm 119:105). Without God our souls are like a dry desert. Maybe that's why it's been so hard to see your way forward? Maybe that's why you've felt so lost? Maybe that's why you've felt so parched?

With God everything can be made new! Would you like to have your eyes opened to be able to see Jesus more clearly? Would you like to have your ears opened to be able to hear Him speak to you? Would you like to leap and dance in the joy of your salvation? Would you like to experience the Spirit pour out into your life making you vibrant and fruitful?

Take a moment to make Jesus the Main Thing in your life today and ask Him to come into your life and make you whole. Don't rush off, sit in the stillness and ask Him what new things He wants to do in your life.
