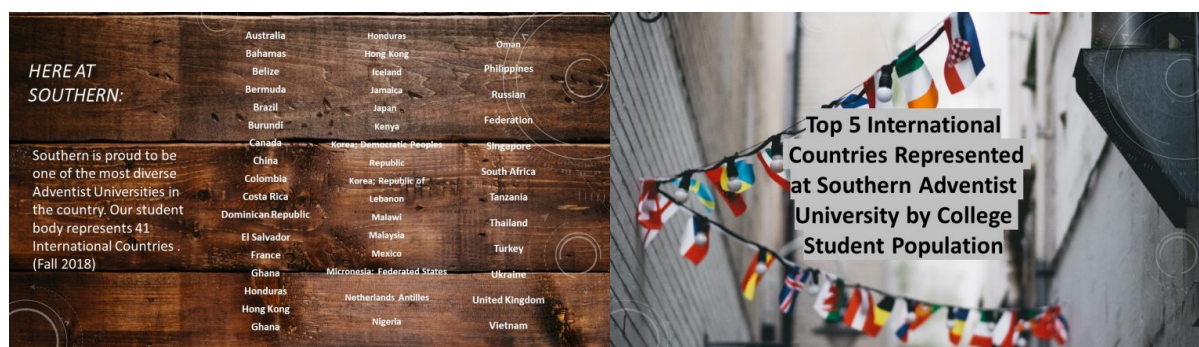

Kenya is fourth on our list of most common countries represented here at Southern. In Kenya, only 13 percent of the population is a member of the Seventh-Day Adventist Church.

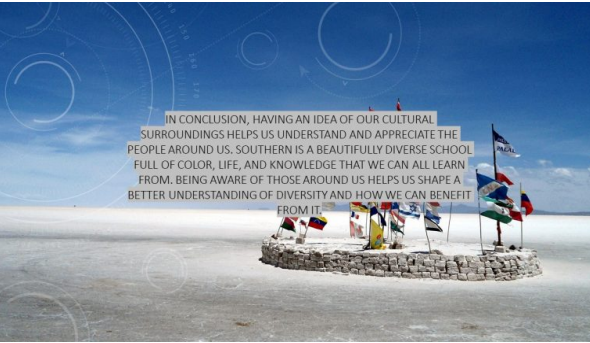
