The cost of each program is usually \$970 per person; however for three upcoming spring programs, it will be reduced to \$97 for directors, vice presidents and above who have been displaced and are looking for work. This is the same fee the center extends to area non-profit executives.

"Executives who have taken these sessions have told us how valuable the learning has been for their growth," said Matthew Shank, dean of the University of Dayton School of Business Administration.
