THE UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON PUBLIC RELATIONS DEPARTMENT

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DAYTON, Ohio, March 4, 1971 --- Project Interface, the academic program at the University of Dayton which brings together UD students and Dayton community organizations and business, is sponsoring 13 educational projects for the current term.

The programs run from an Urban Studies internship and developing a crime profile for the City of Dayton to new attempts at learning experience for grade school children and directing a public relations campaign.

Organizations and business institutions select the area of concern, students are picked for the project and then both groups develop the learning experience. The project, to be acceptable, must prove beneficial to all parties concerned.

Sixty-four students, including ll who participated in the fall term, have interacted with nine different community groups in programs which are serving as pilot projects for this new theory in community education.

The programs also fit in with one of the University's purposes--that of community service.
