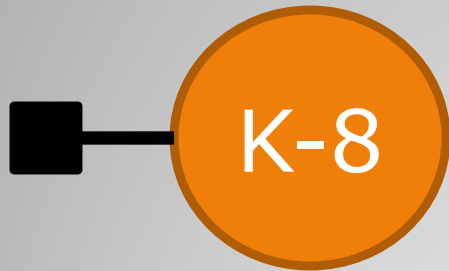

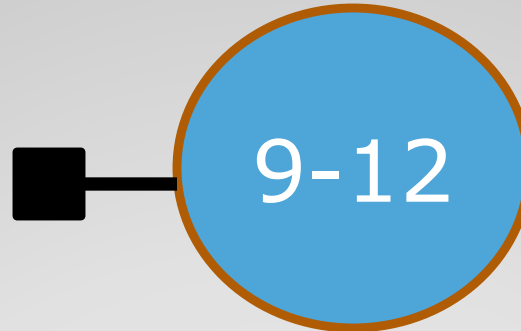

Community of Springfield, OH



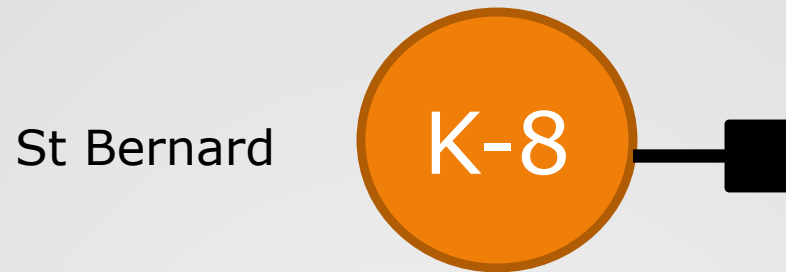
