DAYTON, Ohio, May 7, 1973 --- Reverend John P. Bertolucci, one of the most knowledgeable men in the Charismatic Movement within the Catholic Church, will return to Dayton on Saturday, May 12, for two lectures during a Charismatic Workshop in O'Leary Auditorium on the University of Dayton campus.

Father Bertolucci appeared in Dayton last December and is returning after many requests for a followup workshop.
