

DAYTON, Ohio, June 14, 1974 --- The Executive Committee of the University of Dayton Board of Trustees on Friday, June 14, 1974, approved the recommendation of University President Raymond A. Roesch, S.M., appointing the Reverend Charles J. Lees, S.M., as Vice President for Administration and Planning, effective July 1, 1974. Succeeding the Reverend George B. Barrett, S.M., who was earlier named President of Bergamo Center for Christian Renewal, Father Lees leaves the office of Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost after nine years in that position.

Dr. Joseph W. Stander, S.M., Dean of Graduate Studies and Research, will serve as Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost for the coming academic year, during which a search committee will seek to fill this vacant vice presidential position. The search committee will begin its work at the beginning of the fall term.

Father Lees holds a bachelors degree in philosophy from UD (1943), an M.A. in English from the University of Pittsburgh (1952), and a Ph.D. in English from Ohio State University (1962). Father Lees came to the UD English department in 1964 and was named Provost in 1965 which position in 1973 was redesignated as Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost.

In addition to a B.S. in mathematics from UD in 1949, Brother Stander holds an M.S. (1957) and a Ph.D. (1959) in mathematics from Catholic University in Washington, D.C. He came to UD in 1960 to teach in the mathematics department where he also served as acting chairman several times. In 1967 he became Assistant Dean for Graduate Studies and Research and in 1969 Dean of Graduate Studies and Research. During Brother Stander's tenure as Dean the number of graduate programs has more than doubled.
