UD INTERNATIONAL TEA OPENS HOMECOMING WEEK CELEBRATIONS

DAYTON, Ohio, October 4, 1978 --- Costumes, music, dancing, crafts and cookies from cultures around the world will be represented at the 17th annual University of Dayton International Tea on Sunday, October 8 from 2-5 p.m., in the Ballroom of the Kennedy Memorial Union.

The tea, which is co-sponsored by the UD International Club and University Activities, will officially begin the 1978 Homecoming festivities. The public is invited and guests are encouraged to wear their native dress.

The main event of the tea is the presentation of the Eun Joong Chyung

Memorial Certificate. This certificate is presented in memory of a 21-year-old

South Korean international student who died of cancer in 1961 while attending UD.

This year Mrs. Obedia Jones of Dayton has been chosen. She is a host parent

who has provided outstanding hospitality to several UD students during the past

year.

The tea will include an international entertainment program. UD international students from the Mideastern countries will be singing and dancing. Another group of students called the Shades of Black will perform a modern dance combined with ballet. Two other groups have worked out an unusual combination of international dances which will feature a multi-ethnic representation of couples from many countries.

Dancing for the first time at the tea is Marcela Pajaris, ho will be doing a Peruvian dance. Marcela is a New Lebanon Rotary exchange student from Chiclayo, Peru, and is currently living with Mr. and Mrs. Richard Flora of Brookville.
