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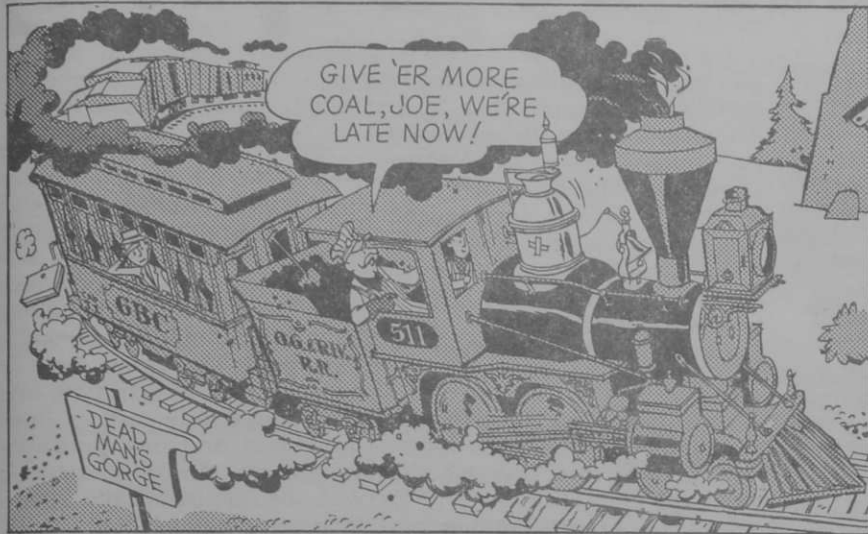

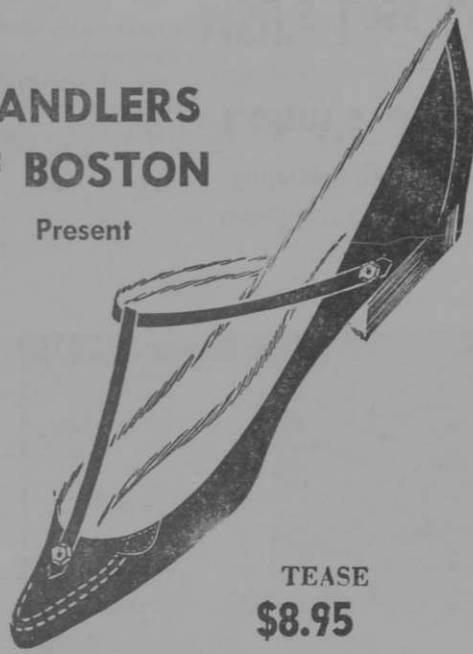

McWeeks Changes McButler's Politics

"I have renounced any plans to further the Democratic Party chances in November or ever again," announced party chairman Paul McButler in a news conference last Saturday, shortly after he had resigned from his job.

McButler, a recent partisan speaker on the campus, said he had undergone a change of heart about his political philosophy, mainly through his contact with college students, Wooster, Ohio College in particular.

In a prepared statement McButler praised the work of the Eisenhower administration, Republican party leaders, and the long historical record of continued service to the nation of the GOP. "Beginning with Abraham Lincoln," he said, "the Republican Party has constantly been devoted to the welfare of America as a whole, and their leadership in the Presidency, Congress, statehouses, and right on down through the county levels has been the dynamic aspect of American politics for 100 years."

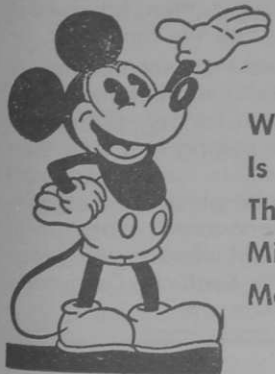

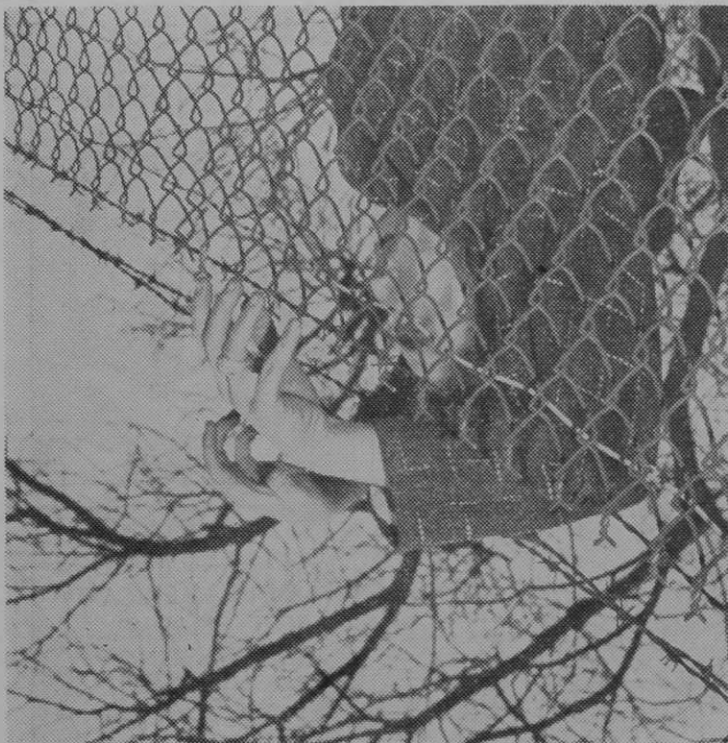

Referees McBush, McGolder, Mc....., and McMorrison have found it necessary to break up illegal holds on several occasions and to insist that the

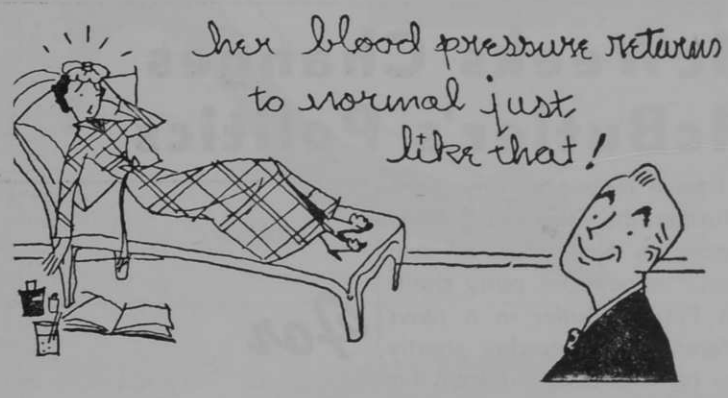
spectators maintain a safe distance from the arena when the activity becomes heated.

**Economy Drops
As WSAF Goes
Ram-O On Stocks**

You think that the economy has taken some bad downswings when the president had an upset stomach? Well, brother, you haven't seen anything yet.

As a result of some unauthorized speculation on the stock market last week, the Dow-Jones averages dropped 25 points over-all. According to a shocked spokesman for the firm, industrial were down 37.2, rails were up 3.1, and utilities were off 39.9. Obviously shaken, the spokesman said that he, personally, had never seen any-

thing to equal the severity of the decline.

Alfred Dow-Jones, British head of the firm, said, in an exclusive interview, that the over-all averages have not been this low since the unexpected death, 24 years ago, of Joe Aberfadorchokoski, foremost landscaper of low-cost government housing projects in Outer Tasmania.

This speculation was the result of a vote taken some time ago by the Board of Trustees of the Wooster Student Aid Fund, Inc. Under the leadership of Dr. Hands Yenny, the WSAF voted to purchase new issues of securities, the proceeds of which were to be used to pay professors' salaries (it being agreed that they were, in a sense, students).

A joint meeting of the Securities Exchange Commission and the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System was called to consider possible methods of counter-attack to restore the slumping market. The most drastic of the proposals considered was one for a 150% margin requirement on the purchase of securities.

Addwight Stevenhower, bipartisan President, has been in emergency consultation with Secretary of State John Foster Dullice, to consider the effects of this crisis upon our foreign relations. A further issue under consideration is the question of how to cope with the anticipated raids of the Cuban rebels, under the leadership of Fidel Castro. It is reported that since receiving the news of the stock-market crisis, Castro's men have been ready to storm the mainland.

Yenny was last seen being run out of town, hotly pursued by a group of angry professors, who were pelting him with their empty wallets. John Maynard Canes, vice-president of the WSAF, announced that group will go right ahead with plans to "fix" the Kentucky Derby and really "clean up."

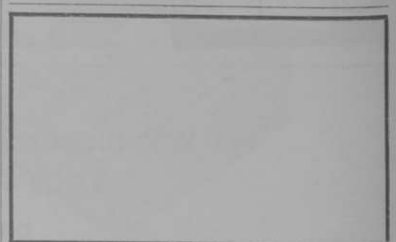

Elephant, Donkey, Political Mascots, Switch Places

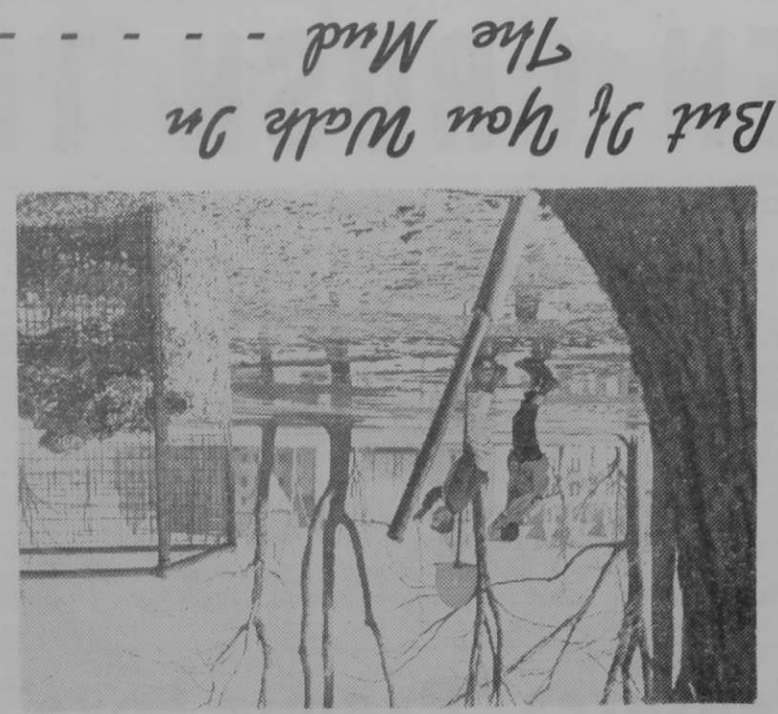

Wooster-In-Wooster Plan

Sidewalk building, landscaping, tunnel construction and a 55 hour work week—all these are features of a new Wooster-In-Wooster Plan announced yesterday by the Galpinian hierarchy, after a twenty-four meeting of the Bored of Trustees. Student labor will take the place of I.S., with the required time doubled.

"We decided to get away from the over-emphasis on liberal arts," said a prominent bored member, "and this program will make Wooster a better physical plant too."

The Bored has not decided whether or not labor unions will be organized. Walter McReuther has been actively campaigning to organize the college local as the Amalgamated Liberal Arts Destroyers of America. Final decision on this will be held back until former labor leader Dave McBeck announces whether or not he will take a local union job. McBeck has ben recently unemployed.

Many projects are being considered in the new program. The ten-year building program has been shortened by five years. High on the list is an underground tunnel between buildings, to beat wind, sun, rain, and snow. Freshman orientation

will consist of pulling upperclassmen to and from classes in rickshaws until a railroad is built.

Students will also do work on a new swimming pool-skating pond next to Andrews patio. Palm trees will be planted for atmosphere.

Coeds will participate in an ivy-growing project. They will eventually cover every square inch of college building. A happy dormitory donor says of this: "Not only will this make Wooster more collegiate, but the quality and style of the new buildings will not have to be so elaborate!" Think of all the money this ivy can save us!

College Treasurer McYoder says the change will lessen the work load of his staff, since students will be paying union dues instead of tuition.

Many other plans are still in the embryo stage. Bored members are very enthusiastic about the change. They will no longer have jobs.

"We always want to stay ahead in the education field," says one Wooster alumni. "This puts us above and beyond similar systems at Antioch, Oberlin, and Hiram."

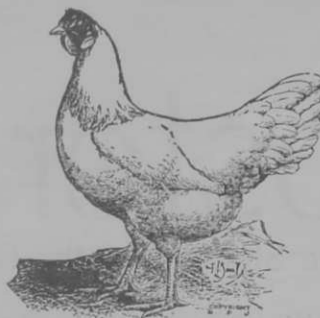

GBI-MEN CRUSH THE SPY RING

The Galpinian Bureau of Investigation broke the huge, international spy ring the NACHT, yesterday in a swift move which has been planned for months. The NACHT (National Association of Collegiate Husband Trappers), which operates on an international basis, has developed a strong movement in the colleges in the past few ears.

GBI investigators located the center of the ring on the Wooster College Campus. They planned carefully for several months and moved in last night on the international symposium which

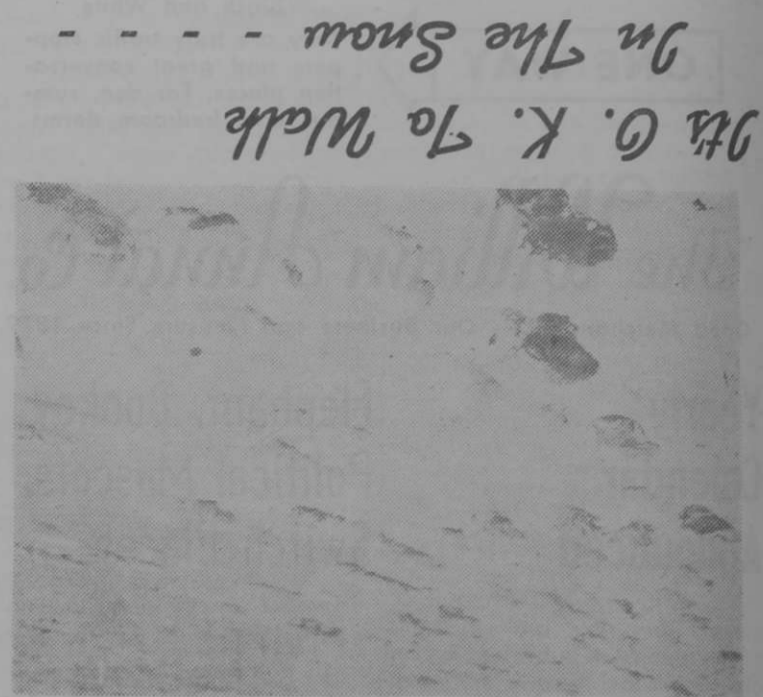

Salary Cut Welcomed
