

# For Church-Government in the House of COMMONS, Saturday 170 July, 1641.

### Imprimis.

Very feverall Shire of England and Wales, to be a severall Circuite or Diocesse, for the Ecclefiaftick Jurifdiction, excepting Torkefbire which is to be divided into three.

A Conftant Presbyterie of Twelve choife Divines to be selected in every Shire or Diocesse. III.

A Conftant - Prefident to be established as a Bishop over this Presbyterie.

This Bishop in each Diocesse to ordaine, fufpend, deprive, degrade, Excommunicate by : and with the confent and affiftance of feaven Divines of his Presbyteric then prefent and not otherwife.

The times of Ordination throughout the land to be A 2

be foure times every yeere, viz. the 1. of May, the the 1 of August, the 1 of November, and the 1 of February.

### VI.

Every Bishop constantly to reside within his Diocesse, in some one prime, or chiefe City or Towne within his Diocesse, in particular.

### VII.

Every Bishop to have one speciall particular Congregation, to be chosen out of the most convenient for distance of place, from his chiefe residence, and the richest in value that may be had : where he shall duely preach, unlesse he be lawfully hindred, and then shall take care that his Cure be well supplyed by another.

### VIII.

No Bishop shall remove or bee translated from the Bishopricke which he shall first undertake.

### IX.

Upon every death, or other avoidance of a Bifhop, the King to grant a Congè d'elire to the whole Clergie of that Dioceffe, and they to prefent three of the *P resbyters* aforefaid, and the King to choose and no minate whom he please of them.

The first Presbyters of every thire to bee named by the Parliament, and afterwards upon the death, or other avoidance of any Presbyter, the remaining Presbyters to choose another out of the Parifb Ministers

Ministers of that shire, and this to bee done within one month next after fuch death or avoidance.

No Bifhop or Clergie-man to exercise or have any Temporall Office, or Secular employment, but onely, for the prefent, to hold and keepe the probate of wills, untill the Parliament thall otherwife refolve.

The Bishop once a yeare (at Midsummer) to fummon a Diocefan Synod, there to heare, and by generall vote, to determine all fuch matter of fcandall in Life and Doctrine among the Clergie-men, as shall be prefented unto them .

### XIII.

Every three yeares, a Nationall Synod to be, which for perions shall confist of all the Bishops in the Land, and of two Presbyters to be chosen by the reft out of each Presbytery, and of two Clarkes to be chofen out of every Dioceffe, by the Clergie thereof.

### XIV.

TM This Nationall Synod to make and ordaine Canons of the Government of the Church, but they not to bind untill they be confirmed by Parliament.

Every Bishop to have over and above the Benefice aforefaid, a certaine conftant Rent allowed and A3
