


7 Reasons Not to Miss the Leadership Conference 2015

Congratulations, Maria Lombart, MA!



Maria Lombart presented her Master's in Leadership portfolio and research project on May 28. Her IRB-approved research project was titled "Adult Third Culture Kid (ATCK) Perspectives on the Relationship Between Childhood Losses and Identity Development." She presented data from her survey of 67 respondents on their reported losses as they moved to various countries as children. This qualitative study also summarized how ATCKs thought this impacted their identity development. "The data collection was extensive," noted Duane Covrig, her advisor. Jay Brand was her second reader for the research project as well as Maria's portfolio. "When I saw an applicant who shared my same Alma Mater, Weimar College, I was impressed," Duane Covrig noted. "We were more impressed when Maria got our highest GRE Graduate School scholarship. Then we were even more impressed when she maintained a 4.0 GPA throughout the

whole program. It was a pure joy to work with her on her research and portfolio. She has many options—graduate school as well as other open doors, and we wish her the best in her choices."

Erica Griessel successfully completed her requirements for the Master's in Leadership with her portfolio and research presentation on June 2. Her research project was an extensive and effective analysis of ticket sales, attendance and income from concerts at the Howard Performing Arts Center (HPAC), where she is the manager. This number-rich study will help her in planning future events for the HPAC, as it is known on Andrews University campus. Duane Covrig was her advisor and Gustavo Gregorutti was her second reader. "Her metaphor of preparing for a half marathon," Duane Covrig noted, "was seamlessly integrated into her review of her leadership development journey. It was one of the best uses of metaphor in explaining one's development than I have read in years. Nice job Erica."
