Michelle Beauchesne (B.M. 1996) studied with artist-faculty Johanne Perron. She is currently on the string faculty at Pine Crest School in Boca Raton and offers private lessons. For six years, Ms. Beauchesne has performed with the Palm Beach Opera, and has also performed with the Florida Philharmonic and Naples Symphony.

Frederic Bednarz (B.M. 1995) studied with artist-faculty Sergiu Schwartz, and is currently in the master's degree program at the Eastman School of Music. He won first prize in the 1997 Prix d'Europe Music Competition in Montreal, Canada. Mr. Bednarz performed with Nicolas Larin frequently, and

they were featured performing together on Canadian national radio.

Daniel Cotter (B.M. 1997) studied with artist-faculty Paul Green and then earned a master's degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music. While at Harid, he won the National Symphony Orchestra's Young Soloists Competition, which awarded him the opportunity to perform with the National Symphony Orchestra in Washington D.C.. Mr. Cotter currently performs regularly at the Sarasota Music Festival.

Erik Frampton (B.M. 1996) studied with artist-faculty Roberta Rust and Richard Dowling and is currently in the master's degree program at Florida International University. He has been a prizewinner in the American Musical Scholarship Association (AMSA) World Piano Competition and a finalist in the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra Concerto Competition.

Janet Harris (B.M. 1995) studied with artist-faculty Arthur Weisberg, and is currently a member of the Florida West Coast Symphony in Sarasota and is a free lance musician. She teaches at various institutions in the Tampa Bay area, including Eckerd College. Ms. Harris will appear this summer as co-principal

bassoonist with the Utah Festival Opera Company.

Qi Liu (B.M. 1999) studied with artist-faculty Roberta Rust and is currently in the master's degree program at Yale University's School of Music. While at Harid, she was a Concerto Competition winner and performed the Beethoven *Piano Concerto No. 1* with The Harid Philharmonia. Ms. Liu won prizes at the Boca Symphonic Pops Scholarship Competition on three occasions.

Matthew Scheffelman (student, 1992-1993) studied with artist-faculty Arthur Brooks. Since Harid, he has performed at Carnegie Hall, with the New York Youth Orchestra, R. Strauss' *Horn Concerto No. 1* and has made recordings with ST-X Ensemble Xenakis in New York City. Mr. Scheffelman currently is a free lance musician and has performed with various ensembles in the Northeast.

Jassen Todorov (B.M. 1998) studied with artist-faculty Sergiu Schwartz, and is currently in the master's degree program at the Eastman School of Music. While at Harid, he won prizes at the Boca Symphonic Pops Scholarship Competition and National Society of Arts and Letters Violin Competition. He has recorded the Brahms Sonatas for Violin and Piano on the Gega New label.

Tao Lin (B.M. 1996) originally studied with artist-faculty Roberta Rust and Richard Dowling and is now a staff accompanist at the Conservatory.

Roberta Rust is artist-faculty (piano) and dean of the Harid Conservatory School of Music at Lynn University.
