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
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ABSTRACT

This report provides summary data on the number of fee-for-service Medi-Cal funded abortions performed during 1999, the type of facility where a procedure was performed, and Medi-Cal expenditures for these procedures. Only abortion claims received and processed for date-of-service January through December 1999 are included in this report. The term fee-for-service (FFS) used throughout this report refers to these claims. The data are presented at both county and state levels. *Estimates* of abortions for enrollees in Health Care Plans (HCP) are included since encounter data are not yet available. A distribution by county is provided.

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HIGHLIGHTS

• Medi-Cal funded a total of 46,005 fee-for-service (FFS)¹ abortions² in 1999 and paid an average of \$318 per procedure, totaling \$14,625,038 for all abortions.

As mentioned in the Introduction, the decline in FFS abortions is partially due to the transition of Medi-Cal eligible women into Health Care Plans (HCP), but also accompanied by an overall decline in the abortion rate over the past decade. There were an estimated 36,320 abortions for enrollees in HCPs, excluding San Mateo and Santa Barbara.

- The average monthly rate of abortions per 1,000 FFS eligible women aged 15-45 years was 6.35.
- Approximately one-third, 33 percent, of Medi-Cal funded abortions were performed for women 20-24 years old.
- Abortion services to Hispanic females accounted for 31 percent of total FFS abortions, exceeding the percentage of white females for the seventh consecutive year.
- Undocumented alien eligible women accounted for thirteen percent of FFS abortions, up from ten percent in the previous year.
- Over half of the abortions, 57 percent, were done at a physician's office, averaging 30 abortions per office location.
- The cost of an abortion performed on a hospital inpatient basis averaged \$2,295 per abortion. Abortions done at a physician's office averaged \$276 per abortion. This is lower than that of abortions done at clinics and hospital outpatient.
- The number of Medi-Cal eligible women who received abortion services was 44,544. Ninety-seven percent of these women had only one abortion, the same percentage as in 1998.

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¹ The term fee-for-service in this report refers to all abortion claims received and processed by the Medi-Cal fiscal intermediary for date-of-service January through December 1999, regardless of the enrollment plan.

² The term abortion as used in this report refers to induced abortions only.

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INTRODUCTION

The number of induced abortions funded by Medi-Cal during 1999, on a **fee-for-service (FFS)** basis, 46,005, is 16 percent lower than in 1998, which had also dropped 16 percent from the 1997 level. Medi-Cal payments for these abortions were 20 percent lower than in 1998.

This decline is partially due to the gradual transition to the managed care system. With the exception of Santa Barbara and San Mateo health initiative programs, claims of services for health care plan enrollees are not submitted regularly. An estimated 36,320 abortions were provided to enrollees in health care plans (HCP), bringing the total estimated Medi-Cal funded induced abortions in 1999 to 82,325. This year a revised methodology for estimating abortions provided by HCPs was developed due to recently available information on trends in abortion rates by aid category over the past decade. The new estimates yield much lower numbers than those previously developed.

While the number of FFS Medi-Cal funded abortions decreased 16 percent, the average monthly rate of abortions per 1,000 FFS eligible women 15-45 years old dropped from 7.06 in 1998 to 6.35 in 1999. With the exception of 1998, this average monthly rate has dropped continuously during the decade of the 1990's, from a high of 10.01 in 1989.

Unfortunately, the total number of abortions for California women is unknown. This report, which encompasses services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries only, is based on a paid claims database and estimates from Medi-Cal managed care enrollment data.

Data Qualifications

This report discusses induced abortions that occurred during calendar year 1999 and appear on the Medi-Cal paid claims file between January 1999 and September 2000. The 21-month file was used to allow for delays in submitting or processing claims.

Abortions performed for enrollees in health care plans (HCP), otherwise known as managed care, are included in this report only as estimates. Encounter claims for these HCPs, excluding San Mateo and Santa Barbara, are reported on a sporadic basis with an unknown level of completeness. Due to the limited reporting, it is not known exactly how many abortions these plans provided during 1999.

This year a revised methodology for estimating abortions provided by HCPs was developed due to recently available information on trends in abortion rates by aid category over the past decade. The new estimates yield much lower numbers than those previously developed.

Counties participating in managed care require that beneficiaries in selected aid categories be placed into HCPs. These are referred to as "mandatory" aid codes. The estimates were derived by calculating the change in abortion rates for beneficiaries in mandatory aid codes in fee-for-service counties and applying the rate of change to eligibility data for persons enrolled in HCPs to project expected numbers of abortions within this population. Table A displays these estimates by county.

To estimate the calendar year total, add the estimated 36,320 abortions to the reported 46,005 abortions. This yields an estimated total of 82,325 abortions for Medi-Cal beneficiaries in 1999.

Estimates were derived by applying the average change from a base of 1991-1993 to 1999 in the abortion rates in "mandatory aid codes" for fee-for-service counties with 100 or more abortions to the eligibility data in managed care counties.

This methodology differs from previous estimates, which assumed the rate to remain the same as in 1993. Data now available show a dramatic decline in the abortion rate for counties with known data, and this estimate assumes the managed care counties would experience a similar decline.

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The abortion rates used in developing the estimates of abortions provided to women in HCPs are as follows:

Medi-Cal FFS Eligibles, Induced Abortions and Expenditures

While total Medi-Cal FFS expenditures increased 77 percent during the past ten years, payments for Medi-Cal funded induced abortions for the same period fluctuated from a high of \$40.7 million in 1991 to a low of \$14.6 million in 1999. The 1999 total is 56 percent less than the 1989 total and 15 percent less than the 1998 total.

The average monthly number of FFS eligible women ages 15-45 dropped 7 percent from 1998 to 1999, while the number of abortions for the same group dropped about 16 percent.

The average monthly rate of abortions per 1,000 FFS eligible women has dropped significantly over the past ten years from 10.1 in 1989 to 6.4 in 1999.

As mentioned in Data Qualifications, the availability of data from HCP is extremely limited starting with 1994, which contributes to the drop in the number of reported abortion services; however, data from counties that are solely fee-for-service support the assumption there has also been a true decrease in the abortion rate.

Distribution of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions by Age and Ethnicity

Women ages 20-24 accounted for the highest percent of abortions among all ethnic groups, 33 percent.

For the seventh year in a row, Hispanic women have accounted for the highest percentage of FFS abortions, fluctuating between 30 and 33 percent of the total. This apparent shift is most likely not an actual shift in the ethnicity of women seeking abortion services, but a reflection of the large number of Hispanic women eligible for emergency services as undocumented aliens. Women in these aid categories would be provided services via the FFS system rather than through HCPs.

Prior to 1993, white women represented the highest percentage, followed by black women.

Compared to 1990, the percentage of abortions for women of Asian and Pacific Islander origin to total abortions remained the same through 1997, five percent, dropping to four percent in 1998 and 1999. Over the same decade, the percentage of abortions for black women has dropped from 26.5 percent in 1990 to 12 percent in 1999.

Distribution of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions by Age and Aid Category

Eligible women in the aid category AFDC (Families) accounted for the highest percentage of Medi-Cal funded induced abortions, 48 percent; however, this aid category is the major component of managed care expansion, resulting in a declining representation in the FFS arena. Although the AFDC group still accounts for the greatest percentage of FFS abortions, the percent has dropped from 79 percent in 1994 to 48 percent five years later in 1999.

The second largest group is the minor consent category, 15 percent of FFS abortions, compared to 13 percent in 1998. Undocumented alien women rank third with 13 percent of FFS abortions, up from ten percent in 1998.

It is important to keep in mind that the majority of health care plans do not cover services for undocumented aliens, so this aid group is concentrated in the FFS delivery system.

Distribution of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions by Type of Facility

During 1999, nearly 57 percent of Medi-Cal funded abortions were performed at physicians' offices, followed by clinics, 30 percent. In comparison, 49 percent of Medi-Cal payments for abortion services were to physicians. Abortions performed at physicians' offices were the least costly. At an average cost of \$276 per abortion, it was \$5 less than the cost at a clinic and \$224 less than the cost at a hospital outpatient department.

The overall FFS average cost per abortion declined from \$368 in 1990 to \$318 in 1999, a 14 percent drop.

Even though only six-tenths of one percent of all abortions were performed at hospital inpatient departments, Medi-Cal payments for these abortions accounted for five percent of total Medi-Cal FFS abortion expenditures, averaging \$2,295 per abortion. The average cost per abortion, excluding those done in hospital inpatient departments, was \$305.

The number of facilities providing abortion services dropped nine percent from 1998 to 1999. The greatest change was in the number of physician offices providing abortions, which decreased 11 percent, from 975 facilities in 1998 to 868 in 1999. The average number of abortions performed in a physician's office also declined, from 35 in 1998 to 30 in 1999, a reduction of over 14 percent.

While the number of clinics providing abortion services dropped to 161 from 169, a five percent decrease, the number of abortions done at these facilities increased four percent from 13,274 in 1998 to 13,828 in 1999. The result is a nine percent increase in the average number of abortions performed per clinic.

Frequency of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions

During 1999, a total of 44,544 FFS eligible women had at least one abortion, which is a sixteen percent drop from 1998. Ninety-seven percent of these women, 43,140, had only one abortion, the same percentage as in 1998.

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County Distributions of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions

The following four tables display the distribution of abortion services by county. Individual county data do not necessarily reflect the same number and expenditure distributions that exist statewide.

Data provided in Tables 7, 8, 9, 10 and 13 are distributed by county of eligibility; i.e., the county that appears on the Medi-Cal card of the beneficiary. It should be noted that this is not necessarily the county of residence at the time of service, since a beneficiary could have moved from one county to another, and her eligibility might have been transferred at the time the service was rendered. Data in these tables may also include services performed outside California for a Medi-Cal beneficiary.

Data provided in Tables 11 and 12 are distributed by county of provider; i.e., county of occurrence.

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

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
