

ABSTRACT



This report provides summary tables on the number of fee-for-service Medi-Cal funded abortions performed during 1996, the type of facility where a procedure was performed, and Medi-Cal expenditures for these procedures. The data are presented on both county and state levels.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Medi-Cal funded a total of 82,569 fee-for-service (FFS) abortions¹ in 1996 and paid an average of \$327 per procedure, totaling \$27 million for all abortions.
- There was an estimated 30,400 abortions for enrollees in prepaid health plans and managed care programs excluding Santa Barbara and San Mateo.
- The average monthly rate of abortions per 1, 000 eligible women 15-44 years old, 6.3, was seven percent lower than that of 1995, 6.8.
- o More than one-third, 35 percent, of Medi-Cal funded abortions were performed for women 20-24 years old.
- Abortion services to hispanic females accounted for 33 percent of total abortions exceeding, for the third year in a row, that of white females.
- OBRA eligibles accounted for about ten percent of total abortions which is one percent higher than in 1995. Most of these abortions were in Los Angeles County, 38 percent.
- More than two thirds of the abortions, 69 percent, were done at a physician's office averaging 51 abortions per office location.
- The cost of an abortion performed on a hospital inpatient basis averaged \$2,146 per abortion. Abortions done at a physician office averaged \$291 per abortion which is lower than that of abortions done at clinics and hospital outpatient.
- The number of Medi-Cal eligible women who received abortion services was 76,662, 11.5 percent less than in 1995. Ninety-three percent of these women had only one abortion.

¹The term abortion as used in the report refers to induced abortions only.

INTRODUCTION

The number of induced abortions funded by Medi-Cal during 1996, on a Fee-For-Service (FFS) basis, 82,569, is about twelve percent lower than in 1995. Medi-Cal payments for these abortions was about twelve percent lower than in 1995.

The decline is partly due to the implementation of managed care programs as explained in "Data Qualification" on page 2. Claims for services rendered to enrollees in these programs were not completed for the period of this report. The estimated number of Non-Fee-For-Service abortions is 30,400.

While the number of FFS Medi-Cal funded abortions decreased during 1996, the number of eligible women ages 15-44 decreased five percent from 1995 to 1996. This resulted in about seven percent drop in the rate of average monthly number of abortions per 1,000 eligible women 15-44 years old. This drop is a continuation of the trend that started in 1988 and adds up to about 40 percent decline through 1996.

Unfortunately, the total number of abortions for California women in 1996 is not available. The 1994 total of 308,564 was estimated by the Center for Disease Control (CDC). Medi -Cal funded abortions for 1994 estimated at \$119,000, including an estimated total of 15,000 abortions for PHP and Managed Care enrollees, accounted for 39 percent of the 1994 CDC estimate.

The CDC total is about five percent lower than the 1993 estimate of 323,944. The estimated Medi-Cal funded induced abortions decreased four percent for the same period, from 124,000 in 1993 to 119,000 in 1994.

DATA QUALIFICATIONS

This report discusses abortions which occurred during calendar year 1996 and appear on the Medi-Cal paid claims file between January 1996 and September 1997. The 21-month file was used in order to allow for delays in submitting or processing hospitals, clinics and physicians claims.

Abortions performed for enrollees in Prepaid Health Plans (PHPs) are not included in this report. Medi-Cal payments to these PHPs are made monthly on a capitated basis. The plans do not submit claims for individual services. Not included also are abortion services for enrollees in different managed care plans excluding Santa Barbara and San Mateo health initiatives. No claims were submitted by these plans for services to Medi-Cal eligibiles. Accordingly, it is not known exactly how many abortions these plans account for. A rough estimate covering all non-FFS enrollees is 30,400/1/. County estimates for abortions are as follows:

Medi-Cal FFS Eligibles, Induced Abortions, and Expenditures

While total Medi-Cal FFS expenditures increased 300 percent from 1977 through 1996, payments for Medi-Cal funded induced abortions fluctuated from year to year, from a low of \$26.6 million in 1984 to a high of \$40.7 million in 1991. The 1996 total was 20 percent less than the 1977 total/1/.

The average monthly number of FFS eligible women ages 15–44 decreased five percent from 1995 to 1996, while the number of abortions for the same age group decreased about twelve percent.

The average monthly rate of abortions per 1,000 eligible women has been steadily declining from 14 in 1977 to 6.3 in 1996.

Distribution of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions by Age and Ethnicity

Women ages 20-24 accounted for 35 percent of abortions for hispanics and 34 percent for blacks. The same age group of asian and pacific islanders accounted for 26 percent of total abortions for that group.

For the fourth year in a row since 1988/1/, hispanic women accounted for the highest percentage of abortions, 30 percent during 1993 and 1994, 31 percent during 1995, and 33 percent during 1996. During 1988 white women accounted for 35 percent of abortions followed by black women, 25 percent, and then hispanic women, 20 percent.

The percentage of abortions for women of Asian and Pacific Islands origin has slowly increased during the past four years from five percent in 1990 to 6.4 in 1996. In the mean time the percentage of abortions for black women has dropped five and a half percent from 26.5 percent in 1990 to 20 percent in 1996.

Distribution of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions by Age and Aid Category

As in previous years, eligible women in the aid category AFDC accounted for the highest percent of Medi-Cal funded induced abortions, 77 percent. The second largest group is the OBRA/1/ which accounted for ten percent of total abortions. This is one and a half percent more than the 1995 proportion, eight and a half percent.

The IRCA/1/ program was discontinued on December 31, 1994.

- OBRA and IRCA refer to two federally mandated programs; the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (OBRA) and the Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA) both of 1986. Under IRCA the status of certain aliens unlawfully residing in the United States may be adjusted to permanent resident status. Otherwise eligible amnesty aliens who are aged, blind, disabled, or under 18 are entitled to full Medical services. Those who are not, are entitled to restricted Medi-Cal services during the first five years of amnesty, and to full services there-after. OBRA applies to other aliens such as undocumented and temporary visa aliens. They are only entitled to restricted Medi-Cal benefits. The IRCA program was discontinued in December 1994.
- Includes 634 abortions for women in the income disregard category, formerly 185% poverty.
- This federal and state funded program became effective in July 1989 under the title 185 percent poverty. The name change occurred in September 1994. It extended Medi-Cal coverage for program-related services to pregnant women whose family income does not exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty level. Distribution of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions by Type of Facility

During 1996 the largest number of Medi-Cal funded abortions was performed at physicians' offices, accounting for 69 percent, followed by clinics, 18 percent. Sixty-two percent of Medi-Cal payments for abortion services was to physicians. Abortions performed at physicians' offices were the least costly. At an average cost of \$291 per abortion it was \$19 less than the cost at a clinic and \$177 less than the cost at a hospital outpatient department.

The overall FFS average cost per abortion continued the declining trend which started in 1991; \$368 from \$380 in 1990. (See Table 1). The 1996 average is three and a half percent less than that of 1995.

Even though only one-half of a percent of all abortions were performed at hospital inpatient departments, Medi-Cal payments for these abortions accounted for four percent of total Medi-Cal abortion expenditures, averaging \$2,153 per abortion. The average cost of abortion, excluding those done in hospital inpatient departments was \$316.

The number of clinics and physician offices providing abortion services was 23 clinics and six offices more than 1995 yet the number of abortions for these facilities dropped about twelve percent for the clinics and 13 percent for the physician offices. Outpatient community hospitals also reflected less abortions, about 13 percent. However, the number of such hospitals dropped to 290 from 293.

Frequency of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions

During 1996, as in previous years, an estimated one percent or less of all FFS Medi-Cal eligible women ages 15-44 had an abortion. Seven percent of these women had more than one abortion throughout the year. The largest group was women ages 20 to 24 who accounted for 37 percent of all repeat abortions.

County Distributions of Medi-Cal Funded Induced Abortions

The following four tables display the distribution of abortion services by county. Individual county data do not necessarily reflect the same number and expenditure distributions which exist statewide.

Data provided in Tables 7, 8, 9, 10 and 13 are distributed by county of eligibility, i.e., the county that appears on the Medi-Cal card of the beneficiary. It should be noted that this is not necessarily the county of residence at the time of service, since a beneficiary could have moved from one county to another, and her eligibility might have been transferred at the time the service was rendered. Data in these tables may also include services performed outside California for a Medi-Cal beneficiary.

Data provided in Tables 11 and 12 are distributed by county of provider; i.e., county of occurrence.
