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I DISCUSSION

INTRODUCTION

This paper is designed primarily to present data on the formal organizational history of governmental units created by statute or constitutional provision by California state government since 1849. These data were collected as part of an attempt to analyze the growth of California government, its causes and consequences. In a later paper, Ted K. Bradshaw and I will describe the changing nature and widening scope of state government activity in California. We did not intend to aggregate the data presented here: we thought the State of California would have a comprehensive list of its own agencies, boards and commissions. To our considerable dismay, we discovered that the only such list in existence was completed in 1939 by a researcher at the University of California.* The result of our dismay is this report.

This paper has two major sections: the first describes methodology used in collecting the data, its organization and its proper use; the second presents the actual data. I have also included a chart showing by year the number of agencies, boards and commissions established, the number

abolished and the net cumulative growth.*

The data include more than 670 governmental units. After perusing stacks of *Blue Books*, budgets, statutes, codes and secondary references, I am conscious that I may have missed an agency, miscoded a date or in some other way erred. First, all corrections are welcome. I lay no claim to infallibility, only to a high degree of accuracy. Second, I am consoled by the fact that even the State of California cannot keep track of its subunits. Not only is there no comprehensive list of subunits, but the 1971 *Blue Book* overlooks an entire department, the Department of Commerce.

METHODOLOGY

I hope to describe my definitions and methods with sufficient precision that my results can be replicated or updated. First I will offer both formal and operational definitions of agency, board and commission. Then I shall note major sources and describe actual procedures.

An agency is an extant governmental body (independent or subordinate) that performs a distinct service or function and employs a number of full-time personnel. Further, subdivisions of an agency that are similar in function or services provided are not counted as separate agencies. For example, Napa State Hospital and Camarillo State Hospital are not counted as discrete agencies, but the Division of Mental Health is. The definition of boards and commissions is considerably looser. It includes all

bodies with plural membership, established by the state government, whether regulatory, advisory or policy-making. The definitions use both function and organizational boundaries as criteria for the discreteness of a unit.¹

The operational definitions I have used are more complicated. Constitutional officers are included if they are elected in state-wide elections, such as the governor and the superintendent of public instruction. Other units listed are agencies, boards and commissions created by statute, acknowledged by statute or recognized in the budget as a separate appropriation item. This excludes virtually all units created solely by executive authority, even those acknowledged by resolutions of the Legislature. There were a few units created by statute but not subsequently funded. Most of these are listed and their fate noted. Agencies that existed for less than two years were noted if created after 1960. I have done this because I expect more users of this report to be concerned with recently created units. Again the number of such units is small.

The operational definition of agencies needs further clarification. Virtually all of the agencies are called departments, divisions or offices. A division is one organizational level down from a department, which from 1927 to 1961 was the level of organization just below the governor. The terminology of departments and divisions dates back only to the 1920s (especially 1927 and 1929), but I have applied it to agencies predating the 1920s if the unit in question was a direct predecessor and if its name was similar.

Because the purpose of this research project is to investigate the growth of state government, I have entirely excluded local government. Since all local government is legally a creature of state government, it is necessary to make this distinction. Intra-state regional bodies appear

only if they encompass two or more counties and appear in the statutes.

In accordance with these procedures, my list consists mostly of units in the executive branch. I have not attempted to trace legislative committees nor the organization of the courts. I have included legislative staff units and various judicial councils, but not the internal organization of these two branches of government.

Major sources were the *California Blue Books* (especially after 1938); the *Governors' Budgets* (especially after 1950); the *Statutes and Statutory Record*; the *California Codes* (especially *West's Annotated Codes*); and, for the period before 1936, the two volumes by Elsey Hurt on the *Administrative Organization* of the state government. I have also relied on numerous pamphlets by the state government on its organization and activities.

For information on agencies, boards and commissions created before 1936, I have relied almost entirely on the work done by Elsey Hurt. Checking on her work revealed two things: first, it was extremely reliable; and second, the earlier budgets and *Blue Books* were very uninformative.

For the years since 1936, I followed a mix of procedures. First, I traced the general framework of organization in the *Blue Books* and the budgets. Then I read the statutes from 1940 through 1975. Until 1974, this was not extremely laborious because the index included two sections that directly answered my needs. These were: a) California, Government of, New Agencies and Reorganizations; and b) Committees and Commissions, Special. After 1974, the indexing of the statutes became far less thorough and these sections were eliminated. For 1974 and 1975, I have scanned the *Legislative Summary Digest* to locate creations, reorganizations and abolitions.² By using these procedures and chasing down every unfamiliar name, I was able to compile a fairly comprehensive list. This I crosschecked against

various government pamphlets, especially those focusing on boards and commissions.

Once having located a reference to the specific sections of the codes or statutes referring to a unit, it was a simple matter to trace the fate of that unit through the *Statutory Record*. In all cases where a section was repealed, I checked the legislation to ensure that the agency did not reappear in a different code section or under a slightly different name. I also checked for any successors. Sometimes these were very easy to spot because the legislation says something like, "The Division of Alcoholism is the successor to the Alcoholic Rehabilitation Division. Whenever any reference is made in any statute or contract to the Alcoholic Rehabilitation Division it shall be construed as the Division of Alcoholism." (*Stats.* 1965, c. 1431, s. 2). Or the legislation may say, "On the effective date of this act the Department of Commerce shall succeed to the duties, powers, purposes, responsibilities and jurisdiction previously vested in the California World Trade Authority, the Office of Tourism and Visitor Services, the Division of Economic Development, and the Department of Agriculture with respect to the Museum of Science and Industry." (*Stats.* 1969, c. 1162, s. 15).

A tiny number of agencies were enacted but never funded. Hence I checked the budget for funding for agencies (though not for boards and commissions, which are rarely funded separately). As I noted earlier, I have also included units that were separately funded in the budget but were created by executive order. These two categories together probably account for no more than twenty units.

I have discriminated between name changes and reorganizations. A reorganization occurs when the function of a unit is substantially redefined

through legislative action. At this time, the old agency is considered abolished and a new one created. This differs from an internal reorganization which merely re-arranges the organizational structure of a unit without altering its basic function. Such internal reorganizations occur frequently within departments and I have not attempted to trace them.

Name changes are far more frequent than substantive reorganizations. In these cases, the name of the agency is changed with little or no alteration in its legislative mandate or organization. An excellent example of this is the Public Utilities Commission. This commission was called the Railroad Commission from 1879 to 1946 even though it acquired its utility regulatory functions in 1911. When its name was changed to the Public Utilities Commission in 1946, there was no shift in its legislatively mandated powers or duties. When a simple name change such as this occurred, it is noted as such and not counted as the creation of a unit.

I have not included every minor name change. For instance, the Division of Mines (established 1880) was called the State Mining Bureau until the 1920s, but I have listed it as the Division of Mines. As this example suggests, I also did not invariably use the original name of the unit. Instead, I have used the name that has been used the longest and that I hope is the most familiar. Where an original name was substantially different from this and was in use for a number of years, I have mentioned it. For example, while the State Division of Lands was called the Surveyor General's Office until 1929, I have used the name, Division of Lands, in the belief that it was a more familiar and equally valid label.

One more methodological tangle needs explanation: determination of dates of establishment and abolition. Usually the date of establishment is the effective date of the statute in question (as opposed to its date

of passage). Similarly, the date of abolition is the date a unit ceased to exist because its enabling legislation expired or was repealed. These dates were the obvious way of measuring the period during which a function or service was organizationally distinct.

Units created in the early period and departmental subdivisions in all periods often did not fit this tidy operationalization. In such cases, I determined the date of establishment by the first time the unit was organizationally distinct; that is, the first time a government publication (including, but not limited to, the statutes) acknowledged that a separate unit was charged with the given function. For example, I traced the Office of Printing in the Department of General Services to the State Printer, established 1850. Since I did not try to keep track of all the reorganizations within the departments, this is not a comprehensive list of all the departmental divisions and bureaus ever created. Instead, I traced the function originally performed by a unit to ensure that it was still performed by some unit within that department; or, if not, to discover when it had been abolished or (more often) transferred to another department. Although these procedures are not as straightforward as I would like, they reflect the mixture of function and organizational boundary in my definitions of agencies, boards and commissions.

THE ORGANIZATION OF THE DATA

The Framework

I have broken up the data by time period and by policy area. There are four time periods: 1849 to 1900, 1901 to 1936, 1937 to 1960, and 1961 to 1975. Within each time period, the units are listed chronologically by date of establishment. Within each time period, the data are further

divided into six general policy areas: General Government, Business and Transportation, Natural Resources, Health and Welfare, Agriculture and Services and Education. These correspond to the agency structure instituted by Governor Reagan in the late 1960s. Not only did these six divisions exist for the last years covered but they also make sensible categories for the actual activities of the state government since its inception. Within each of the six areas, I have separated agencies and constitutional officers on the one hand from boards and commissions on the other.

The Meaning of Each Column

1. The name of the unit refers to the name it had for most of its existence. Any major name changes for departments, boards and commissions are noted as such in the Predecessors and Successors column. In general, I have not tried to keep track of the names of departmental subdivisions during the numerous reorganizations.

2. The name in parentheses immediately after the name of the unit refers to the department(s) with which the unit has been associated. In the case of units established before 1936, I have not noted every departmental association, but I have noted the departments with which the unit was associated the longest. This is more comprehensive after 1936. The reader should not infer that the department with which a board or commission is associated in any way controls or supervises that board or commission. In many cases, boards and commissions are formally independent although affiliated with a particular agency.

This set of parentheses also occasionally includes a phrase describing the activities of the unit. This is done if the information is not readily available in a *Blue Book* for the appropriate period or if the activity cannot be inferred from the name.

3. The date established refers to the first time the function performed by that unit became organizationally distinct. Generally, this means the effective date of the statute establishing it.

4. The Predecessors and Successors column includes information helpful in tracing the origin and fate of the various units. As with the other categories, it is more comprehensive in the later years. Here I have noted when departmental subdivisions became departments in their own right. "n.c." refers to name change and "reorg." to reorganization. A reorganization usually signals the death of one unit and the birth of another.

5. The date abolished means the year in which a unit ceased to exist. It includes abolitions, expirations and a few cases of loss of funding.

6. If the answer to "Vital in 1976?" is "Yes," then some governmental unit is performing that function. In the case of departments, boards and commissions, the current name should be either that given in the first column or the last name change listed under Predecessors and Successors. This is probably not true for departmental subdivisions. The numerous internal reorganizations in departmental structure made it impractical to trace every change. In these cases, the answer "Yes" means that the function in question is still performed by an organizationally distinct unit of the department or its direct successor.

PROPER INTERPRETATION

The operational definitions described above should be kept in mind in order to avoid misconstruing this data. For instance, since I have relied primarily on the statutes, this is by no means an exhaustive listing of every unit of government, even within the executive branch. The

reorganization of the health departments provides another illustration of this. It is listed as occurring in 1973 when the legislation became effective rather than 1970 when it was passed.

This list does not show the organizational structure of the state government at any given time. I saw no need to include such organizational charts because the organizational structure of the state government is readily available in the *Blue Books* published after 1938, and in the *Governors' Budgets* published since the late 1940s. What is not readily available, and is included here, are the many minor boards and commissions and their departmental association or general policy area.

I have not included specific citations to statutes or the codes. For units created before 1936 these are available in *California State Government: An Outline of Its Administrative Organization* (Vols I and II) by Elsey Hurt. For units created after 1936, refer to the index of the statutes for the year cited as the date of establishment, or refer to that of the year previous, since the effective date was occasionally the year after the date of passage. This method should also work for most agencies created before 1936. This will provide the initial citation that can then be traced through the *Statutory Record* and, in many cases, the *Codes*.

Finally, it is important to remember that this is a purely formal institutional analysis. The agencies and, in particular, the boards and commissions listed vary greatly in size and significance. The Public Utilities Commission (established 1878), small in size but large in regulatory power, is listed alongside the Shell Egg Advisory Board (established 1971), which is small in both size and significance. Also, some units probably exist only on paper. How often do the governor, the treasurer,

and the controller sit around a table, saying, "All right, we are now convened as the Committee to Fix Interest on Registered Warrants"? Without extensive interviewing and observation, it is impossible to discover how many of the units listed here exist solely on paper. My impression is that the vast majority of the units are real and represent responses to a perceived real need felt by those concerned both inside and outside government.

NOTES

¹My thinking about these definitions, both formal and operational, was clarified by reading Kaufman's *Are Government Organizations Immortal?*. Kaufman looks at bureaus in the federal government in 1923 and then again in 1973. Since he focuses on organizational survival, his criterion for inclusion as a bureau is limited to organizational boundaries. I have used both function and boundary because I am concerned with the expansion of government responsibilities as well as the raw number of governmental units.

²In the future, the *Central Appointments Registry* should be of great assistance in tracing recent boards and commissions. This public document is available in the State Library in Sacramento and in the county clerk's office in every county. It lists all the appointments made by the governor, the speaker of the Assembly and the president pro tempore of the Senate. At present it also notes the last date the law was changed. Unfortunately it does not include boards whose members serve solely by virtue of their position in government (e.g., interdepartmental coordinating bodies).
