The Sompong Sucharitkul Center for Advanced International Legal Studies at Golden Gate University in San Francisco recently hosted its 24th Annual Fulbright Symposium on International Legal Problems. The theme of this year's symposium was "The Effectiveness of International Law." The event was attended by approximately 100 participants and guests, including diplomats, scholars, lawyers and students.
