A FACULTY SENATE-STUDENT LEADERSHIP STATEMENT ON DISSENT

The Faculty Senate, the elected leaders of the Brockport Student Government, and the leaders of the Black Student Liberation Front cannot and will not condone or support violence or destruction or defacing of any kind, on the Brockport campus, in the community, or elsewhere in the nation. Furthermore, we urge that the lessons of South Carolina State, where three Black students died on February 7, 1968 and Kent State University, the scene of the death of four White students on May 4, 1970, not be ignored. We do encourage peaceful confrontations which have the potential for violence. Emotionality must not overwhelm rationality.

We firmly believe that there are appropriate responses and actions that can and should be taken at SUMY Proceport to support or protest various political decisions. These actions can and must be consistent with the educational traditions of colleges and universities, a tradition which has made the academic communities centers of dissent. To do otherwise is to victimize the college and the academic community (students-faculty-administration), deliberately or unintentionally, under the banner of protesting against an internal and external situation.

Finally, we urge the exection of a student-faculty-administration body, the majority of whose mashers shall be student leaders, that will be responsible for reacting to future situations in a way that will be consistent with the sentiments expressed in the first two paragraphs. The campus can no longer affort the lummry of responding to events on an ad hoc, "lets have a meeting and see where we go from here" basis.
