RESOLUTION ON IMPLEMENTATION OF COMPUTER SKILLS TEST

Whereas

there has been substantial progress in implementing the computer skills test, including setting up a dedicated lab, hiring a coordinator, and offering multiple test sessions

and whereas

all incoming freshmen in Fall 2000 will be enrolled in a 1 credit course in preparation for taking the test

and whereas

a trial year of offering the test to large numbers of students will be beneficial to the implementation process

and whereas

the Enrollment Management Division needs lead time to educate prospective students about the requirement

be it resolved that

the computer skills test be required of all incoming students, freshmen and transfers, in Fall 2001.
