#### **Rationale for Changes**

One of features of the REL curriculum is a semester-long fifteen-week internship at one of hundreds of approved sites locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. Preparing students for this experience is very time consuming since students attempt to meet with the instructor individually to go through the application and interview processes. This is not very efficient. A one credit seminar would bring focus to the myriad of professional issues that students will encounter as they make the transition from the classroom to the work place.

# **Description of New Course**

Focuses on developing the professional competences of recreation and leisure students consistent with industry expectations. Examines professional career preparation including skills assessment, portfolio building and resume writing, internship application processes, interview techniques, college-to-career transition, professional ethics and

selected contemporary career building seminar topics. Requires students to host outside speakers, conform to prescribed dress code, and participate in professional organizations.
