A three-day conference during the Centennial Year of the College

The Purpose: A conversation of eminent persons from a variety of fields discussing "The University as a creator for the future"--analysis and synthesis of higher education for the twenty-first century.

The Aims: The primary task will be to analyze future educational needs and resources in light of extrapolated developments in population growth, international relations and health.

A secondary task would be to determine specific areas for follow-up discussions, and to suggest outstanding resource persons for these future discussions.
